Reflection

Hope

The Letter to the Hebrews gives the classic definition of faith, precisely because it is divinely inspired, not the work of the human mind:

Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the conviction of invisible things (Hebrews 11).

Faith is intimately related to hope – what lies in the future. Faith is intimately related to realities that are invisible.

It is the Jubilee Year of Hope. We should ask what is hope?

Hope is placing our faith in what God promises.

God promises us many things, both now and into the future. He promises us 'labourers for the harvest' if we pray. He promises that if we 'remain in Jesus, we will bear much fruit.' The list goes on and on.

The ultimate promise is eternal, resurrected life with God. So, notice what the preacher says in Hebrews:

Abraham and Sarah are the great examples of faith and hope because they believed in the resurrection of Christ.

Can this be true? Apparently it is:

Abraham was confident that God had power even to raise the dead, and so, figuratively speaking, he was given back Isaac from the dead.

So, there you have it. It is yours to believe.

Amen.

WALKING TO EMMAUS:


Ministry with the Young & Searching
