Briefing Document: "Where Do Dead Christians Go?" – Lesson 5

With Introduction to "The Judgment of the Believers' Works" - Lesson 1

This document summarizes the key themes from the transcript-based message, focusing on Christian eschatology—particularly the Rapture and the judgment of believers' works. I. The Rapture: A Rescue Operation and Glorious Reunion

 - Instant Transformation: Believers' "lowly body" will be "conformed to His glorious body" (cf. Philippians 3:21).

- Heavenward Movement: Described as faster than the speed of light, passing through air ruled by Satan (cf. Ephesians 2:2).
- Perpetual Presence with the Lord: Eternal presence with Christ. (cf. 1 Thessalonians 4:17; Titus 2:14)
- The Church Triumphant and Church Militant
 - Church Triumphant: Believers already in heaven.
 - Church Militant: Believers on earth engaged in spiritual warfare (cf. Ephesians 6:10–18).
- Comfort and Hope
 - Christians never say a final goodbye—it's always "see you later."
- Animal Question (Worldly Concern)
 - Scripture is not definitive, but joy in Christ will eclipse earthly concerns.
- Signs of the Rapture
 - The Rapture will occur suddenly, without warning.

II. The Judgment of Believers' Works: The Bema Seat

Key Concepts

- Purpose of the Bema Seat
 - Evaluates faithfulness, not salvation. Separate from the Great White Throne Judgment (cf. Revelation 20:11–15).
- Timing of the Bema Seat
 - May occur at death, in present heaven, after the Rapture, or after the Millennium (cf. Hebrews 9:27).
- Test by Fire
 - Works tested by fire: gold, silver, precious stones vs. wood, hay, stubble (cf. 1 Corinthians 3:13–15).
- Degrees of Reward
 - As there are degrees of punishment (cf. Luke 12:47–48), so also degrees of reward.
- Motivations for Paul and Believers

- Christ's Return, Glorifying God, Revelation 22:12, 2 Corinthians 5:9–10, 5:14, 5:17, Romans 14:12.
- Old Testament Saints
 - Currently with the Lord in disembodied state. Await glorified bodies at the Rapture.

Greek Words and Terms

- 1. 1. Bema (βῆμα)
 - Pronunciation: BAY-mah
 - Definition: A raised platform or judgment seat; used in Scripture to describe the place where believers' works are evaluated (2 Corinthians 5:10; Romans 14:10).
- 2. 2. Logos (λόγος)
 - Pronunciation: LOH-goss
 - Definition: Translated as "word" or "account"; used in financial and logical contexts (Romans 14:12).
