

#### **Church Chat** from the Pastor

It has been two months since I have made my way here and I have found this parish to be the most rural of all the parishes I have been assigned. I have been in some of the largest parishes; some of the poorest and smallest parishes in the Archdiocese. I have been in parishes that had huge schools, small schools and now no school. Each place I have been has been special to me because histories or the people or events or experiences. Every Parish had its own charm; you just have to go and look for it. I still keep in contact with people from many of my former assignments, though some have passed away. They are treasures God has given me over the years.

Coming here has been a pleasure. Having grown up in Montgomery County, we used to come up to Green Lane Park and go swimming and barbequing and fishing and hiking. It was always a good time outdoors here. I am rather familiar with the area and now must get into the deeper map. Thank goodness for Ways!

I have felt very welcome here. You have been most supportive of Father Anthony as he moves on to a much bigger parish and school and also for me as I start my journey here. I also find that you are very hands on as a community. You don't farm anything out unless you can't do it yourself. That is so neat. That is what I grew up with.

People ask me "what are my plans?" I have no real Agenda at this point as I am not familiar with the details of Saint Philip Parish. My first year is always a year of look and listen. Sometimes I tweak a thing of two, but, on the whole, I will leave things be because if it has been working for you, why would I fix it?! There is time on our side and we can walk instead of running to get things done.

There will be more communications as I learn more and experience more, so do not think I am off the radar. I am still meeting people and striving to learn names and ministries and so much more. I am a little slower not that I am in my 60's. I never thought of that just a few years ago! But you know what that is like.

I want to thank you again for all your welcoming smiles and words of support. With God's mercy and love, we will continue to strive to do the Good that our Lord put us here to do!

SPN Parish Council Holy Moment Thought...
"COME TO ME. I WILL UNBURDEN YOU."

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11: 28-30).

We have a gracious invitation from Christ Jesus but how do we respond to this invitation? We can come to Christ in: Prayer; studying His Word; receiving the Eucharist; and Reconciliation; and encountering Him in the poor. Some examples of the burdens that we can bring to Christ are our fears, worries and doubts about our health, family, finances, food, job, future, and possessions. However, what we should first be thinking about bringing are our burdens of sin!

We bring all the above to Jesus in confident trust that He promised to help us and will not fail. How does Christ give us the promised rest? He cancels our debts of sins and relieves us once and for all from guilt. Sometimes He heals our bodies and finances. At other times, He gives us insight to view our woes from a supernatural perspective. You could call this supernatural perspective 'indepth perspective therapy'. People go to the Shrines of Our Lady of Lourdes in France and Guadalupe in Mexico for physical healing. Many such people receive 'in-depth perspective therapy' and decide to stay behind to minister to pilgrims sicker than themselves. This is the work of grace.

What yoke does Christ invite us to take upon ourselves? Answer...the yoke of Christ is the Gospel of Christ. The yoke of Christ is the Sermon on the Mount.

Christ Himself says that this yoke is both easy and light. John the Apostle says that "His commandments are not burdensome..." (1 John 5:3). Remember, Christ is both the Teacher and the Lesson. Learn to be with me. Learn to be like me. "For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." (Matthew 11: 30).

What makes the yoke easy and the burden light? **Grace**. The grace of God makes easy what is most difficult and revolting to nature. Grace makes light what is most burdensome. This is the secret of the saints. Saints suffer imprisonment, persecution and even death because they have the grace of God to help them. Without this grace, it is impossible for human nature to embrace these crosses. Jesus Christ has promised us His grace if we embrace Him and His teaching. With His grace on our side, all things become possible. "My grace

is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12: 9). With our daily bread of this grace given at the beginning of each day, we are equipped to live fully for Christ in these areas of human struggle: health, family, finances, job, tools, food and future!

Say the following prayer...Lord, give me this day my daily bread of your grace. Amen.
