For Aaron, his career path has recently brought him back to where it all started—St. Paul Lutheran High School in Concordia. After several years of teaching History at The Lutheran High School of Kansas City, Aaron is now beginning his new role as Director of Admissions and teacher for his alma mater. It's now his opportunity to do for others what his teachers did for him.

As is our tradition each fall, the Missouri District is pleased to celebrate *Tomorrow's Teachers & Preachers*—the campaign to promote church work vocations and give a boost to our scholarship endowment.
