We are an inclusive and affirming parish; the sacraments of the church (baptism, communion and marriage) are available to all people on equal terms. Christ welcomes you, and so do we.







When we are broken and cast aside, embrace us in your love.



# Readings for August 17th – The 10th Sunday after Pentecost

**Isaiah 5:1-7** In this Song of the Vineyard, Israel and Judah are asked to pass judgment on themselves. The prophet implies that the failure of justice and righteousness will lead to disaster for the Lord's elect people.

**Psalm 80:1, 2, 8-18** With the same vine image for Israel, God is called upon for help, preservation and life itself.

Hebrews 11:29—12:2 The people of God are encouraged to hold fast in their faith, recalling the strength of those who have gone before, especially Jesus, the 'pioneer and protector' of their faith.

Luke 12:49-56 Jesus describes the cost of discipleship in terms of divisions it may cause.
