

Good News from Grace July 2025

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD turn his face towards you and give you peace. (Numbers 6:24-26)

I do not know about you, but when my feelings are hurt, someone says something I don't like, or maybe an interaction was slightly uncomfortable, I have this desire to isolate. It can be tempting to be by one's self where no one can hurt you, say the wrong thing, trigger past emotions, etc. It can seem like peace being by oneself for a while. But true isolation from the world and ones support systems can and does cause significant harm in a persons life. We are social beings, who were created to be in relationship. We were not designed to live life on our own. And when we isolate, we often times enter into depression, and the longer we isolate, the less and less likely we seek out groups or even people in general. Sometimes, it seems like a good idea to avoid all possible pain of rejection, unresolved trauma, hurt feelings, etc. But in the Christian world, God calls us to enter into relationship and dialogue with one another, even though we may hurt each other sometimes. Christian community is not about always saying or doing the right thing. It is about recognizing when we don't say or do the right thing, seeking to apologize and asking for forgiveness. And on the flip side, when someone says something to us or does something to us that hurts us, we are called to work towards reconciliation and forgiveness. This type of relationship is always harder on the person who was hurt. It is also important to note that there is no timeline on how long reconciliation should take. But if we are going to live the way God is calling us to live, we must be open to asking for forgiveness, and providing forgiveness. As a Christian people, we are not called to retreat when we are harmed, but rather live into grace and mercy as God has provided us grace and mercy. This is not to say that we should put ourselves in harms way intentionally or that we should not do our best to be kind. There is also a need for punishment and sometimes even separation from those whom do harm us, especially depending on the severity of the action. It is also always important that we be sympathetic to those who were harmed and we must give them space to heal. But we also must encourage each other to face those who persecute us, by loving them and forgiving them, as Jesus calls us to. As always, what Jesus calls us to do, is never easy. My point is, that we should not be afraid to enter into relationship with others because we are afraid that we will get hurt, or experience pain, or be disappointed in the community. Because community is at the same time, a place of love and hurt, a place of true joy and disappointment, a place where our needs can be met and where they are ignored. Jesus reminds us that love is worth the risk of pain. And when the Christian community is done right, we will do our best to first do no harm, love those in our midst, encourage reconciliation when we inevitably fail, and lift one another up with grace and mercy. Resist the urge to isolate when things go south. Your church family isn't perfect, but it is a place where love and support is found. Never forget that you are loved so deeply by our God and by this community at Grace. May you never feel alone.

Dear friends of Grace -

I want to give you an update on my seminary journey! I've been a student for two years now and have approximately two more years to go. It's been a while since I've seen you all because during the previous academic year, I was completing Sunday fieldwork at St. John's in Shiremanstown. This fieldwork consisted of observation and participation in a new-to-me congregation. Fieldwork is the first of three internships I'm required to complete. Along with field work, I was busy with the following classes: Pastoral Theology, Lutheran Theology, the History of Lutheranism in America and Church in Society (learning about how people, traditions and communities shape congregations).

In January, I participated in a travel seminar to Turkey and Greece, where our travel group followed the footsteps of Paul on his second missionary trip, as written in the book of Acts. We also visited 6 of the 7 churches in the book of Revelation. This was a very special time for me to be on a journey with classmates, pastors and professors as we learned about the landscape and history of the time as well as the difficulties Paul and his faithful travel partners faced to teach others about Christianity and spread the good news about Jesus Christ to Europe. I've included a photo of me by the river where Paul met and baptized Lydia, near the city of Phillipi, Greece (Acts 16. 11-16). Lydia was a faithful believer, a busy businesswoman and prayer group leader. By opening her heart, she was led by the Holy Spirit to listen to Paul and give him resources for his missionary journey.

The next internship I will begin is called CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) and I will be doing the program at Wellspan Gettysburg Hospital. I will be working there throughout the next academic year, while completing other seminary classes. I'm looking forward to learning about how to accompany people through health challenges and be a guide for spiritual comfort during difficult times.

Again, thank you for your continued support and prayers during this time in my life. You are all a source of comfort and inspiration as I continue to study the Word and learn about ways to share God' love and grace with others.

- 7. Council voted to allow the purchase of a new refrigerator.



This service is provided through our land records software partner, Landex (Optical Storage Solutions). When you sign up, you'll receive text or email alerts if a new document is recorded under your parcel number. Please note that the Recorder of Deeds Office cannot sign up residents - individuals must register using the link below. This service is funded by the Recorder of Deeds Record Improvement Fund, so it does not use county tax dollars. Congratulations to Grace Youth Selected to Attend the Synod LT Camp in July







Grace's Book Club has selected, "The Violin Conspiracy" by Brendan Slocumb as the July book. The riveting story of a young Black musician who discovers that his old family fiddle is actually a priceless Stradivarius: when it's stolen on the eve of the world's most prestigious classical music competition, he risks everything to get it back. Growing up Black in rural North Carolina, Ray McMillian's life is already mapped out. But Ray has a gift and a dream - he's determined to become a world-class professional violinist, and nothing will stand in his way. Not his mother, who wants him to stop making such a racket; not the fact he can't afford a violin suitable to his talents; not even the racism inherent in the world of classical music.

When he discovers that his beat-up,

family fiddle is actually a priceless Stradivarius, all his dreams suddenly seem within reach, and together, Ray and his violin take the world by storm. But on the eve of the renowned and cutthroat Tchaikovsky Competition - the Olympics of classical music - the violin is stolen, a ransom note for five million dollars left in its place. Without it, Ray feels like he's lost a piece of himself. As the competition approaches, Ray must not only reclaim his precious violin, but prove to himself - and the world - that no matter the outcome, there has always been a truly great musician within him.
