Welcome to March, and essentially, Lent. Lent is a very busy time in the church year. There are extra services, things asked of us, and just usually a busy season in the secular world as well. But during all the busyness, I hope that we can find some time to slow down and just be with God. Lent is that perfect season to rekindle or strengthen our relationship with God. The season asks and encourages us to do more with God, which in turn asks us to do less with the world. What I mean by that is that during Lent, we are called to enter into spaces with God more frequently, which requires us to take time away from other areas of life. And what I encourage us all to take note of, is which area of life are we less willing to give up time for? Which area of our life is God not allowed to take? Which area of life have we put before God? This isn't meant to shame or judge, this is just a reality that all of us humans face. All of us have gods that we worship, that can easily be put before our one true God. We all do it, and most of the time it happens without us even realizing it. There is a reason why the first commandment is "to have no other gods before me," because God knows that this is one of the hardest and most prevalent sins.

There have been trends in recent years, to instead of giving something up for Lent, that we should instead give towards something. I think this is well intentioned, and can certainly be an additional spiritual practice that we do during Lent. I do think, however,

that the practice of giving something up for Lent is still worthwhile and crucial to our spiritual discipline and development. I recognize that some people do not have a lot, and therefore giving something up seems almost impossible. But, giving something up doesn't always have to be about possessions or consumerism. Giving something up for Lent could be a behavior, a habit, a desire, a vice, etc. We all do things that we wish that we didn't, and Lent would be the perfect time to give oneself the excuse to give that up. We could also just give up something that we like to do, that isn't harmful at all, but we give it up for a few weeks to let God and ourselves know, that we do not need it to be joyful or faithful.

Lent is all about preparing our souls for Easter. It is about recognizing what our sins are, what we can do about them, what we cannot do about them, and where ultimately, we need God. Lent is not about making us better people, it is about making us Godly people. And my definition of Godly, is not perfect people, but people who do nothing, say nothing, think nothing without including our God above. Because we know that it is not through our own works, but through the Savior on the cross, that we are saved and that we are welcomed into the family of Christ. Our sins reveal our need for God, Lent awakens us to those sins, and Easter reminds us that we are forgiven and set free. Enter into Lent with an open mind, be open to and honest about your sins, but do not feel shame or judgement, make them opportunities to see God's grace and grow closer to the One who loves us to the core of our souls, no matter what.


Faith Formation Children & Youth

- 6. The 2025 Budget was presented at the Congregational Meeting on January 26, 2025.




Members and Friends of Grace,

On the 5th April representatives from the Braver Angels Lower Susquehanna Alliance will be at Grace. We have invited Braver Angels back but to host a debate. A Braver Angels' Debate differs from the typical political debate that we see during a political campaign. The "... point isn't to win; it's to understand the other side a little better."
