Scriptures: Ecclesiastes 1:1–14; Romans 14:7–9 Series: *Start at the End: Living Life Backward* 

The Hebrew word <i>hebel,</i> translated in Ecclesiastes as "meaningless" or "vanity," means,, or,		
The Teacher in Ecclesiastes describes life as a series of endless (1:4-11).		
Romans 14:8 reminds us, "Whether we live or die, we to the Lord."		
Without God, feels meaningless. With God, it becomes
