





Please note: All are welcome to receive home-made bread, wafers or gluten free wafers. Please just ask when you get to the front.

All are welcome to drink from the chalice or to touch the chalice while the words are said. We are not permitted to dip bread into the wine (intinction) in this Diocese.

All Praise to Thee (SINE NOMINE) – This has always been one of my favorite hymn tunes: grand, triumphant and easy to learn. It provides an uplifting opening for worship and reminds us all of the glory of God.

For the Healing of the Nations – Set to a classic tune by Henry Purcell, this hymn calls for healing, freedom and love, all three of which are much needed today.

We Walk by Faith – This modern hymn tune SHANTI by well-known Catholic hymnist, Marty Haugen, pairs beautifully with the setting: short, concise, and simple, reminding us of the importance of our faith in life's journeys. For this reason, Ariana and I have selected this hymn as the Gospel Acclamation for our wedding liturgy.

Communion Hymns:

For a change of pace, all Communion hymns selected are modern hymns. *I Am the Bread* and *Take and Eat* both remind us of the meaning behind receiving the bread and wine. *Spirit and Grace* is new to us at St Andrew's but it is one of my favorites for school masses, as it reminds us of the spirit and grace the Holy Meal offers, and calls us all to the Lord's Table.

God of Grace and God of Glory – Wrapping up the service with the upbeat Welsh hymn tune, CWM RHONDDA, we pray for the world's peace and justice, calling for God's grace to grant all of us wisdom and courage.
