The clergy and laity of General Synod heard God calling the Right Reverend Shane Parker, Bishop of Ottawa, to be our next Primate. I have enjoyed working with Primate Shane over the past several years and I know he will serve Christ and His church well.

General Synod Reflections

Where do I begin to speak about my experience of General Synod 2025? Do I speak of the whirlwind and the collective exhaustion or the privilege and encouragement I personally experienced? Maybe it would be better for me to share the overwhelming sense of prayer, grace and passion for the work of the church throughout the proceedings. Acting Primate Anne Germond led the General Synod with grace and gentleness recognizing weighting thoughts, feelings and experiences that may be painful and triggering. She took much time for prayer, silence, hymn singing in response to these, at times, evocative and divisive motions.

I was recently asked, "why are you an Anglican?" It is an important question for all of us to consider. For me, it is the fact that we are a 'thinking' church where things aren't always black and white and we acknowledge the 'grey' of

Wildfire/Flood Resilience Response Grants launched!

In partnership with Alongside Hope (formerly known as PWRDF), the Ecclesiastical Province of BC/Yukon have launched an initiative to provide funds for parishes or dioceses/Territory for the purposes of building resilience, supporting recovery and enabling creative ways to respond to potential wildfires or floods. The Alongside Hope grant is \$50,000 and will be dispersed by a committee for grants up to \$8000

A Provincial committee was established with representation from across the Province and is chaired by Bishop Clara Plamondon. The committee's mandate is to accept applications, review, and recommend grants to the Metropolitan so that funds can be disbursed as needed.

This program is not to replace established funding avenues through Government agencies or not-for-profit emergency response organizations. Funds are to support the work of parishes and communities who are either dealing with the aftermath of a wildfire/flood event, or who are looking for ways to anticipate how their parish or diocese/Territory can engage with communities they serve in the event of a future wildfire or flood.

This pilot project came out of a similar response that Alongside Hope initiated with the Diocese of Halifax and PEI during Hurricane Fiona. It was such a success, that Alongside Hope reached out to our Province to create a similar model as we deal with reoccurring wildfires and floods.

Examples of funding might include things like: upgrading electrical outlets in a hall to accommodate charging stations; purchasing a generator to provide backup energy in a parish facility; child care programs while parents deal with the aftermath of an event; emergency preparedness
