

About today's cover art: "Jesus, the Fiery Prophet", painting by Jyoti Sahi, 2002. "Fire is a frequently found image in Jyoti's painting. For, the works and words of Jesus are not only about healing and compassion; he is also the fiercely critical prophet of unjust ways that wound the poor, the vulnerable and those pushed aside from their God-intended place in the human community, their rightful share of earth's life. Jyoti quotes Jesus words: 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish that it were already kindled'. He is the burning bush, who speaks to Moses from the fire, declaring that he has seen the suffering of his people, and is about to act to set them free. Jesus is consumed with anger because he sees and feels all the evil of the world, and how creation needs to be transformed... In some tribal stories too there is going to be a great fire, a fire that will clear away the thorns and choking weeds of the forest, leading to re-generation of earth's life." Children are welcome at all services! It is important for families to worship together. Don't feel your child must be absolutely quiet or still, for we are glad to have children—and all their wiggles, giggles, and squiggles—as part of our community and worship life! After all... as an

old saying goes, "faith is caught, not taught!" Children are encouraged to stand and sing with the songs, partake in communion, read and pray along when they can, and join in for the "Early Word"—a time at the front with conversation just for them near the beginning of the service. Most Sundays September through June, we have "Children's Church" activities during the latter two-thirds of the service in our Upper Hall, to which any pre-school through grade 5 aged child is welcome! For those accompanying infants or toddlers who need a spot to 'escape' to during the worship service, feel free to make use of the "Quiet Room" off the side of the sanctuary, near the piano, where there you will find comfortable seating, toys, and a changing table all while being able to hear and see the worship service.



Recording and streaming in use: Please note that video cameras and microphones are capturing our worship services, and that the resulting content may be transmitted over Zoom. YouTube, or other platforms.

Likewise, from time to time still photography of our worship services may be taken and used for church communications, websites, and other uses. By your presence within the sanctuary, you are indicating your consent to the possibility that your likeness may be captured and used in any of these ways. While video capture of congregants in the pews is relatively minimal, if you wish to guarantee you will not ever be depicted on video, the area at the rear centre of the pew seating area is unable to be picked up on camera.



Washrooms can be found just outside the sanctuary through the door at the front right of the space (the northeast corner of the room).

Rev. Dr. Kimberly Heath Elected and Installed as 45th Moderator: On August 11th, the United Church of Canada joyously installed the Right Rev. Dr. Kimberly Heath as its 45th Moderator at Knox United Church in Calgary. Elected after three ballots at the 45th General Council (August 7–11), Rev. Heath is a long-time minister who has served Wall Street United Church in Brockville, Ontario since 2007.



The installation ceremony, which was livestreamed, included prayers in English, French, and Stoney Nakoda. Rev. Heath received several symbolic gifts and delivered a heartfelt reflection, encouraging the church to embrace its diversity and "bring out all of the flavours, all of the goodness." As the spiritual leader of the United Church, she will now serve a three-year term.

The church committed itself to radical love and affirming people of all

identities, strengthening its witness to justice and love in action.

The statement was prepared by an Apology Task Group appointed to draft an intentional living apology to move beyond statements to explicit action. Welcoming Pastor Youngsun: At the beginning of September, we're looking forward to welcoming Youngsun Cheon onto our staff team as our new Associate Minister, half-time for a two-year appointment. Many thanks to all of you from around our congregation who participated in the town hall conversation on July 13th and the special congregational meeting on July 27th to move things forward for our church taking advantage of this special opportunity.



Mr. Cheon completed his Master of Divinity studies at the Vancouver School of Theology this past spring, and is a candidate for Ordained Ministry in The United Church of Canada. His ministry among us—and learning from and alongside us—forms the final stage of his candidacy pathway toward ordination, his Supervised Ministry Education requirement. You might think of this as not altogether unlike a "residency" like what medical doctors complete following medical school. His being able to be in ministry among us for this phase of his journey has been made possible by the foresight and generosity of a number of others around our United Church community here in the Lower Mainland.

Pastor Youngsun already comes to us with significant church ministry experience, including being part of the ministry team at Becoming Church, one of the United Church new church start communities currently growing in New Westminster (a ministry role he will continue even as he starts with us) and a variety of both pastoral and lay ministry roles in his native South Korea. In Korea, he was affiliated with the Korean Methodist Church, and prior to his time at Vancouver School of Theology, also completed studies at Methodist Theological University in Seoul. Earlier, he also spent time in the Toronto area as an undergraduate at Seneca Polytechnic.

Youngsun begins on September 2, with his first Sunday sharing with Rev. Matt in worship leadership on September 7. While it will be a wonderful asset to have another native Korean speaker on our staff, it is important to emphasize that Mr. Cheon's position and ministry role won't be focused specifically on our Intercultural Ministry. Rather, Pastor Youngsun will be engaged in general pastoral ministry throughout our congregation alongside Rev. Matt, combined with some special programmatic emphases on community engagement and on faith formation among newcomers-to-Christianity.
