


The Tenth Sunday after Pentecost (Proper 20) Sundays@4

and a night free from sin;


and, at the end, bring us to everlasting life.

People The lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.


All Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.



- 5 I will ponder the glorious splendour of your majesty and all your marvellous works.

- 8 The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, slow to anger and of great kindness. *REFRAIN*
- 9 The Lord is loving to everyone and his compassion is over all his works.
- 10 All your works praise you, O Lord, and your faithful servants bless you.
- 11 They make known the glory of your kingdom and speak of your power;
- 12 That the peoples may know of your power and the glorious splendour of your kingdom. *REFRAIN*
- 13 Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom; your dominion endures throughout all ages.
- 14 The Lord is faithful in all his words and merciful in all his deeds.
- 15 The Lord upholds all those who fall; he lifts up those who are bowed down.
- 16 The eyes of all wait upon you, O Lord, and you give them their food in due season. *REFRAIN*

- 17 You open wide your hand and satisfy the needs of every living creature.
- 18 The Lord is righteous in all his ways and loving in all his works.
- 19 The Lord is near to those who call upon him, to all who call upon him faithfully.
- 20 He fulfils the desire of those who fear him, he hears their cry and helps them. **REFRAIN**
- 21 The Lord preserves all those who love him, but he destroys all the wicked.
- 22 My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord; let all flesh bless his holy name for ever and ever. **REFRAIN**




Affirmation of Faith

Said by all, standing.

Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the first and the great commandment. The second is like it: Love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.

Intercessions and Thanksgivings (All sit)

All sing the refrain **twice** in **Latin** at the beginning. As the leader speaks the verses of the psalm, we hum the refrain softly. Between the prayer petitions, we sing the refrain **once** in **English**.

Give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service,

that all people may know the glorious liberty

of the children of God;

through Jesus Christ our Lord,


