Threshold Housing for Youth Monthly Outreach for August 2025

The Threshold purpose is to provide housing and support for young people in difficulty. "The homes offer stability for youth at risk of homelessness so that they might complete school, undertake work training, and to find employment." For example: housing in a safe environment, building life skills and healthy relationships, peer and community connections, and to learn healthy coping. Threshold Housing Society was born in Victoria in 1990 out of concern from community members in response to the number of people living on the streets, it was supported by Rick Sandberg, a Victoria Anglican Street Chaplain and by group of concerned Anglican parishioners.

Their achievements are extensive, the following are a portion ...

1992 – opened Mitchell House for men

1997-opened Holly House for women

1997 - received charitable status from Rev. Canada

2012 - launched SAFE, supported independent living - Greater Victoria

2014 – Forest House bequest

2016 - Partnered with Oak Bay United, opens Threshold House, flagship home

2022 - \$3.2 million gift from Carole & Clint Forster

One of the many aspects of Threshold Housing for youth is what they refer to as Wrap Around Supports; one of which is quoted from the website:

"helps to foster peer relationships and creates a sense of community for those within, and waiting to join Threshold. It provides opportunities for youth to be just that, youth. So many of our youth haven't had the opportunity to learn, play, and develop the skills and relationships that this programming offers."
