Some clarifying questions we were asked, and I ask you to consider include:

What UMC ministries are you connected with beyond the local church? Why or why not?

What can you do to support district and conference leaders?

How is your church better equipped to proclaim and embody the gospel because of the connection? Welcome to August. In June of this year the Annual Conference was held. While there, we were introduced to the core values that came out of the town hall meetings across Iowa last year with the bishop and her team. These are values that arose in conversations across the state that we as United Methodists strive to live into and that we United Methodists across the state have stated are who we are. There are six total core values for our conference that came out of those conversations. I would like to continue to share one a month for the rest of the year with you along with the questions we were asked to discuss at our tables during the conference so that you mightconsider them yourselves.

The second core value is connection and being part of a connectional body. "We forge deeper connections, understanding ourselves to be part of a connectional body that is larger than ourselves. We offer our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our witness, and our service in a vital web of interactive relationships." If we look at this through the Wesleyan quadrilateral we see support for this core value.

SCRIPTURE - 1 Cor 12 "Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.", Ephesians 4:11-16 "... The whole body grows from him, as it is joined and held together by all the supporting ligaments. The body makes itself grow in that it builds itself up with love as each one does its part."

TRADITION - "Connectionalism in the United Methodist tradition is multi-leveled, global in scope, and local in thrust. Our connectionalism is not merely a linking of one charge conference to another. It is rather a vital web of interactive relationships. We are connected by sharing a common tradition of faith... a constitutional polity...a common mission... a common ethos." – Book of Discipline ¶132 – The Journey of a Connectional People

REASON - Connection for United Methodists describes our organizational structure of conferences at various levels. However, early Methodist connection was built in relationships and shared mission, not structure. Connection is a relational understanding that we are interdependent on one another and a belief that the true nature of the church is not encompassed in any one congregation, but how we are bound together to proclaim and embody the gospel.

EXPERIENCE - Structurally, efforts like the United Methodist Committee on Relief or Africa University are supported by and held accountable through our General Agencies and apportionments. But we also know the relational impact of these ministries when Emergency Response Teams show up after a tornado and as we celebrate the gifts of our pastors educated at AU.



Summer Music / Hymn Sing



Treasurer's Corner

So, for the August Tower we're going to treat July like last month, i.e., "Directionally Correct." Again, the numbers presented here are only the actual numbers I have so far for the month of July:

- Income is currently at \$12K out of a plan of \$13K...just a bit soft, common for this time of the year.
- Expenses are currently at \$18K out of a plan of 21K.
- The year-end operational cash position is still projected above the \$30K level (easily seen in the chart below).

Here is the supporting chart:



We were able to avoid having to tap into the Trustees' "stop-gap" apportionment funding for July.

With our softer income this month, I did need to move \$5K out of our MMkt account to bolster our Operations checking position. This is actually factored into the chart pictured above.

For the Capital Campaign:

- Great News!! <u>The loan is paid off!!</u> However, this project is technically NOT closed yet...not until we receive all committed pledges, which will run through/into 2026.
- Your Administrative Council voted to give Gary the authorization to use Trustees earned interest funds to pay off the loan, thereby eliminating the balance of the loan's interest expense.
