

#### SCRIPTURE LESSON

1 Samuel 17:38-50 (NIV)

Then Saul dressed David in his own tunic. He put a coat of armor on him and a bronze helmet on his head. David fastened on his sword over the tunic and tried walking around, because he was not used to them.

"I cannot go in these," he said to Saul, "because I am not used to them." So he took them off. Then he took his staff in his hand, chose five smooth stones from the stream, put them in the pouch of his shepherd's bag and, with his sling in his hand, approached the Philistine.

Meanwhile, the Philistine, with his shield bearer in front of him, kept coming closer to David. He looked David over and saw that he was only a boy, ruddy and handsome, and he despised him. He said to David, "Am I a dog, that you come at me with sticks?" And the Philistine cursed David by his gods. "Come here," he said, "and I'll give your flesh to the birds of the air and the beasts of the field!"

David said to the Philistine, "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. This day the LORD will hand you over to me, and I'll strike you down and cut off your head. ### "David: Daring with Goliath" Series: Voices of the Hebrew Scriptures

**Background:** First and Second Samuel appear as a single literary unit in the Hebrew Scriptures and are considered part of the Historical Books. In the Hebrew tradition, they belong to the "Former Prophets" (Joshua, Judges, Samuel, and Kings). Though named for the prophet Samuel, the central character is David. Written around 930 B.C. and recounting Israel's transition from the time of the Judges to its first monarch, the Book of Samuel tells the story of David's rise to the throne from God's perspective.

<u>David's story is one of contrasts.</u> David, whose name from the Hebrew *dwd*, means "beloved," was the youngest of eight sons born to Jesse of the tribe of Judah. He was a shepherd, musician, poet, warrior, and king. Yet, there were times when he acted out of fear, fell into adultery, and ordered the death of another man. Still, God chose David because he was "a man after God's own heart" (1 Samuel 13:14). David's story reminds us that the only true king of Israel is Almighty God, who alone is worthy of trust and obedience (2 Samuel 7:22). The establishment of David's throne was a key moment in the history of redemption, for through David's bloodline the Messiah would be born to save the world. Fully God and fully man, Jesus fulfilled God's covenant with David as the eternal King whose reign will never end (2 Samuel 7:16).

**Sermon Idea:** Called by God and anointed by the prophet Samuel, David began his journey to becoming king of Judah and Israel. First, however, his character was put to the test. Armed with only five smooth stones and a sling, David dared to step forward in faith...and the giant fell. This victory was not about David's skill, but about God's power working through a person who trusted God completely. In David, we see that courage is born from faith. David dared to trust God, and no obstacle—no matter how gigantic—could stand against God's purposes.

#### Sermon Application: How to be daring when facing giants.

- 1. **Assess the Situation:** Understand your motivation and the challenge before you through God's perspective, not just human eyes.
- 2. Gather What You Need Get Rid of What You Don't: Use the gifts and tools God has given you. Don't wear "Saul's armor if it doesn't fit your calling."
- 3. **Go and Do:** Step out boldly in faith, trusting that God will empower you to overcome obstacles.
