and their encounter with the Creator in this place goes before our own.



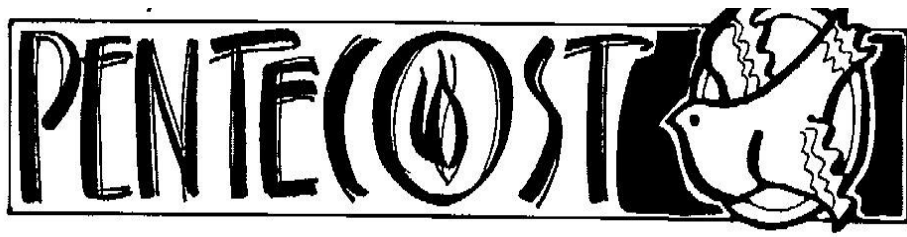

Presentation by Cuban artist & curator Juan Carlos Rodríguez Valdés, with translation by Wilson Gonzalez-Rico

Come join Juan Carlos as he explores how ancestral wisdom continues to inform contemporary artistic practice. His presentation shares the development of his life's work through an anthropological, psychological, philosophical, and poetic lens. Working across video, photography, installations, and performance, he explores ways that art connects us to the roots that define our identity.

Juan Carlos will also discuss his influential FARMACIA project, which uses art as a healing process to reintegrate humanity with nature. Drawing on ancestral memory and imagination, this vision has evolved through educational programs and gained international recognition at the Havana Biennial, offering a poetic path back to our essential connection with the earth

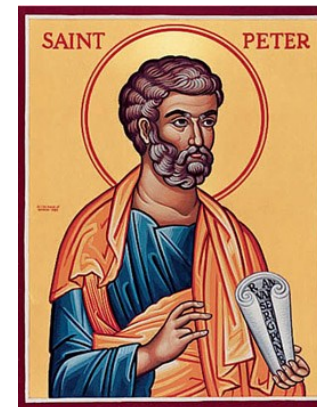
