Serving our neighbors in the Grand Saline & Fruitvale ISDs

The budget cuts that we keep reading about have finally had a very real impact on Grand Saline and our neighbors. I received a call today that the East Texas Food Bank has been asked to reduce spending by over 2 million dollars. In effort to do this as fairly as possible, they compared and contrasted the amount of non-processed, whole foods being received and distributed per county, and per town.

Van Zandt County and Grand Saline/Fruitvale are at the top of the lists, based on the amount of produce provided to our clients through Breaking Bread and our Mobile Pantry. I consider this a great compliment, as it shows that our clients are receiving fruits and vegetables at or above recommended levels.

Over the past few months, the Mobile Pantry program has already been forced to close one half of their produce distributions to save money. We were spared because our partners at ETFB were able to show their supervisors photos of smiling young Grand Saline ISD students working shoulder to shoulder with our members serving our community. Maureen and Blair went to bat for us, holding us as a shining example of inclusion, encouraging young people to learn the value of volunteerism.

Maureen called today to say that they really tried to keep us, but we will no longer have a monthly Mobile Pantry. She was going to call Superintendent Micah Lewis and share the news with him as well.

I would like to personally thank each of you who has shown up, sacked up, and distributed literally tons of fruits and vegetables. You made this fun. I know we touched lives and made new friends, and it is because of you.
