

Day 1: Our True Identity in Christ

Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:1-9

Paul's opening words to the Corinthians remind us of our true identity in Christ.

Despite their failures, Paul addresses them as "sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be his holy people." Today, reflect on your own identity in Christ. How does knowing you are a new creation, set apart for God's purposes, change your perspective on your daily life? Remember, real change begins with accepting what God says is true about you. Pray for the Holy Spirit to help you live authentically into your new self, expressing who you truly are at your core.

Day 2: Unity in the Body of Christ

Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-17

Paul's plea for unity among believers is as relevant today as it was for the Corinthians. Consider the gravity of disunity - it tears apart the very family Jesus is putting together. How might you be contributing to unity or disunity in your church community? Remember Paul's call to "be perfectly united in mind and thought." Today, commit to being a net-mender rather than a net-tearer. Look for ways to build bridges and heal rifts, focusing on our shared identity in Christ above all other differences.

Day 3: The Power of God's Love

Reading: 1 Corinthians 13:1-13

While not directly mentioned in the sermon, this famous passage on love encapsulates the heart of unity Paul desires. Reflect on how God's love, demonstrated through Christ, has the power to overcome all divisions. How can you

embody this love in your relationships, especially with those who are different from you? Ask God to fill you with His love, enabling you to see others as He sees them - as beloved children worthy of grace and acceptance.

Day 4: Living as New Creations

Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:16-21

Paul's emphasis on our new identity in Christ is further explored in this passage. As new creations, we are called to be ambassadors of reconciliation. How does this calling challenge the way you view yourself and others? Consider areas of your life where you might still be living according to old patterns or worldly identities. Pray for the courage to fully embrace your new identity in Christ and to live it out in all aspects of your life.

Day 5: Overcoming Differences for the Gospel

Reading: Galatians 3:26-29

This passage beautifully illustrates the unity we have in Christ that transcends all earthly divisions. Reflect on how the early church, composed of diverse backgrounds, was a powerful witness to God's kingdom breaking into the world. What differences in your own church or community seem to create barriers? How can you actively work to overcome these differences, demonstrating the unifying power of the Gospel? Ask God to help you see beyond surface-level distinctions to the shared identity we have as children of God.
