Part 1: STOP! Read That Verse Again

Scripture: Psalm 119:153-160; *The Living Bible (TLB)*

Supporting Scripture: Psalm 34:17-19

Context and Background: Psalm 119:153-160 is part of the longest chapter in the Bible, Psalm 119, an acrostic poem structured around the Hebrew alphabet. This particular section corresponds to the Hebrew letter "Resh" (¬). The letter **Resh**, the 20th letter of the Hebrew alphabet, possesses rich symbolic and numerical significance, offering insights into biblical themes of leadership, authority, and new beginnings. ¹

The overall context of Psalm 119 is a deep exploration of the value, power, and nature of God's Word and its influence on a believer's life.

The Psalmist teaches by his own example that those who are devoted to the service and fear of God must not be discouraged, though they are not rewarded for it in this world. Their condition upon earth is one of warfare. Therefore, they should not be dismayed by diversity but rather rest satisfied with the consolatory consideration that the gate of prayer is open to them.²

Beloved, like the Psalmist, our devotion to God does not mean we will not have our problems (vv. 156-157). The writer faced great suffering, but he did not let his pain become an excuse to turn away from God. All of God's Word, not just certain parts, is true and reliable, so continue to trust in God. **TGBTG!**
