According to Dallas Willard, God wants us to pray because it is:

- 1. Relational: prayer draws us close as children to our Father (Matt. 6:6).
- 2. **Formational:** prayer transforms our desires & gives us peace (Phil. 4:6–7).
- 3. **Participatory:** prayer lets us share in God's Kingdom work (Matt. 6:9–10; James 5:16–18).
- 4. **Fruitful:** prayer flows out of abiding in Christ, shaping us to will and to act with Him (John 15:7).



Pray continually

- 1 Thessalonians 5:17

1. God initiates through His Word, Spirit, circumstances, and people.

2. We respond with prayer, obedience*, and trust.

*Shema - Hear, Listen & Obey

"The true mark of maturity isn't just Bible knowledge or discipline-keeping, but being the kind of person who naturally hears and responds to God's voice in everyday life."

For Willard, listening to God isn't about mystical experiences — it's about cultivating the kind of relationship where talking and listening to God becomes as natural as breathing.

Suggestions:

- 1. Leave time at end of prayer to be silent and listen
- 2. During prayer, pause and listen
- 3. Learn listening for God's voice through Immanuel Journaling
- 4. Practice conversational prayer with God throughout the day
- 5. Create space in your day for silence, to intentionally listen for the Holy Spirit
