



Affirmation of Faith: The Nicene Creed

Celebrant: (pg. 188) Let us confess our faith, as we say,

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

In the same way he took the cup, saying, "This is my blood which is shed for you. When you do this, you do it in memory of me." Remembering, therefore, his death and resurrection, we offer you this bread and this cup, giving thanks that you have made us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. We ask you to send your Holy Spirit upon the offering of your holy Church. Gather into one all who share in these sacred mysteries, filling them with the Holy Spirit and confirming their faith in the truth, that together we may praise you and give you glory through your Servant, Jesus Christ. All glory and honour are yours, Father and Son, with the Holy Spirit in the holy Church, now & for ever. Amen.

Mental Health Highlight

Sabbath rest is part of the Christian tradition, though our current busy lives and consumer culture push back against this. When we engage this holistically, rather than legalistically, it can provide physical, mental, and spiritual renewal, foster deeper connection with God, and strengthen community & family bonds. It's a time to cease from work, recharge, and realign priorities, helping us move towards a more balanced and fulfilling life.

Reconciliation Awareness Highlight

One of the gardens at the Alberta Legislature Grounds is a tribute to truth and reconciliation in this province. The name of the reconciliation garden is *Kihciy Maskikiy/Aakaakmotaani*. These are Cree and Blackfoot words, respectively, that mean 'sacred medicine/save many people.' Indigenous Elders named this garden and guided its design. Within the garden is a monument to honour the victims and survivors of Canada's residential school system, titled 'Mother Earth Circling: Healing from the residential school experience.'
