
Join us for lunch and a dramatic performance of Impossible Faith: the Story of Corrie ten Boom.



n August 10th twenty-two of us joined Traci Fontana-Wegelin around the campfire. Using the scripture Psalm 91:1-7, Traci entitled her message "Scary Go(o)d" as she



shared some of her camping experiences. Camping can become a transforming experience as we realize once again that God's protection goes with us wherever we are. We do not change God, rather God changes us. We were asked to share a camping experience we have had with another person and how we may have realized from that camping experience that God continues to be with us no matter our circumstances. During our time around the campfire, we also sang four campfire songs.

The service on August 17th saw twenty-one people join with Julia who entitled her message "Let the Rivers Flow" from the scripture where Jesus quotes "Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water" (John 7:37-39). At the beginning of the service Julia poured water into a bowl and said among other things that water is essential for all of life on the Earth. 71% of the Earth's surface is water with most of it being salt water. Fresh water, among other things, is cleansing, odourless, tasteless, and the universal solvent. Our bodies are mostly water and so the question remains where are we giving life as the rivers of living water flow from us? The day's moment of reflection asked us to ponder this question.
