The Rector's Corner

In the Letter to the Hebrews, the faithful departed are spoken of as surrounding us, like a great cloud. They are called "witnesses", for by lives of faith they testified to the grace and truth and hope of the Lord Jesus Christ. These witnesses are also called "saints" – "holy ones" – and often they are remembered by the Church on the day of their death. Their lives are like road signs for us as we travel this old life. Through their memory we remember what is important – *Who* is important – who we belong to and where we are going.

Today, in its Calendar, the Church remembers St. Bartholomew the Apostle. In our Diocese, there have been at least two church buildings named after him: in Birch Ridge (near Plaster Rock) and on Rothesay Avenue in Saint John. Our beloved friend, Marjorie Sheehan, was a member of the latter.

St. Bartholomew's Church in Saint John



Not much is known about St. Bartholmew himself. His name means, "son of Tolmai" and some believe that he also was known by Nathanael. It is thought that his father was a farmer. He preached the Good News in Armenia (now part of Turkey) and may have gone on to India where it is said that he left behind a copy of the Gospel according to St. Matthew. If so, the timing of his visit is unclear because, according to some accounts, Bartholomew met a gruesome death. He was flayed alive by order of Astyages, the Armenian King. Remembering his bloody death, the Altar is dressed in red today.

In Christian art, St. Bartholomew is portrayed with a flaying knife, his skin draped over his arm. Often, he is holding a copy of St. Matthew's Gospel in his right hand.

The Gospel appointed for St. Bartholomew's Day recounts the strife that arose among the disciples as to which of them was the greatest. In response, the Lord Jesus said, "Let him who is great among you be the least, and he who is leader be like one who serves.....I am among you as one who serves." (St. Luke 22. 26-27) From all records, Bartholomew followed these words. He denied himself in service to Jesus, the One Who had loved and served him. With God's help, so may we.
