

### Pathway of Prayer – September Sermon Series

I've been walking, playing, and backpacking in the woods since I was a little kid. Growing up near the Appalachian Trail in Tennessee, I learned early the importance of planning a backpacking trip—what to take (and not take), what to look for, and how to stay safe. My path to becoming an Eagle Scout instilled a life -long love of backpacking. I've hiked hundreds of miles of the AT through Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania. I love the planning, the packing, the white blazes, the mountain-top views, the shelters...but most of all, I love the journey.

Prayer is a lot like backpacking. It has a starting point, a path to follow, tools to carry, companions for the road, and a destination worth the journey. This September, we'll travel the Pathway of Prayer by walking step-by-step through the Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6:9-13. Jesus taught this prayer as an invitation into an intimate, grace-filled relationship with Our Father. Martin Luther described God as "a good and loving parent-eager to listen, compassionate, generous." John Wesley called prayer a "means of grace," through which the Holy Spirit renovates and transforms our souls.

Each phrase of the Lord's Prayer shapes our hearts for the journey: trust, surrender, dependence, forgiveness, and protection. Here's our

### **RECYCLING AT CALVARY**

If you ever place recyclable items in our Recycling Dumpster, please be sure to read this notice:

Reminder! NO plastic bags may be placed in Calvary's Recycling Dumpster. There are fines from the recycling site where our trash haulers deliver our recyclables which our hauler will pass on to the church if plastic bags are in the container. There are cameras on the trucks to monitor what is in our container and we will be fined \$165 if there are plastic bags, even just one.

If you are taking recyclables out to the dumpster you must place the items so that they are loose in the dumpster and not within a plastic bag. Allowable recycla-

bles are: newspaper, cardboard (boxes must be broken down), glass jars or bottles, aluminum & tin cans, hard plastic bottles, jugs & jars (#'s 1, 2 or 5 only). Thank you for your cooperation!


### ADOPT-A-GRAD

The 2025-2026 Sunday School year will begin on Sunday, September 7th. Classes are held from 9:45—10:45 AM



for Preschool through Adult. Nursery care is also provided.

<u>Preschool Children</u>—We are excited to offer *Cokesbury Kids Big Faith*. This exciting curriculum will help children grow a faith that's as big as their imaginations! Children will learn through timeless Bible stories, hands-on activities, and age appropriate themes. *Big Faith* offers faith-formation experiences that are tangible, applicable, and meaningful to children's everyday lives.

Kindergarten, 1st Grade, 2nd Grade, 5th Grade, & 6th Grade—Back by popular demand from our teachers and kiddos is *ThinkOrange* 252 Kids Curriculum. What does 252 represent? It's not the number of questions a 2nd grader can ask in 20 minutes. Instead, everything taught is based on one of the three basic, but powerful truths modeled by Jesus in Luke 2:52: I need to make the wise choice. I can trust God no matter what. I should treat others the way I want to be treated. Kids will be filled with wonder, discovery, and passion!


