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## SMALL GROUP HOMEWORK: DOUBLE VISION EQUALS DIVISION

**Sermon Recap:** In this message from Genesis 15:1-4, we explored how physical vision impairments parallel spiritual ones. Emotions, aging, fear, and distortions can blur God's clear vision for our lives, leading to "double vision" and division. But through Scripture and focus on Christ, we can restore clarity and unity.

**Instructions:** Use this sheet in your small group this week. Read the key Bible passages, reflect personally, and discuss as a group. Pray for clear spiritual vision.

### Reflection Questions

- 1. Emotional Impact on Vision (Genesis 16:1-4; 2 Corinthians 10:5; Proverbs 28:26)** How have emotions like anxiety, fear, or uncertainty caused "double vision" in your life—distorting your view of God's promises? Share an example and how you can "*bring every thought captive to Christ.*"
- 2. Aging and Nearsightedness (Genesis 16:5; Matthew 13:14-15; Ephesians 4:17-19)** As we age or face life's pressures, we can become spiritually nearsighted, focusing only on the immediate. What long-term promise from God have you lost sight of? How can your group help each other refocus on eternal vision?
- 3. Closing Eyes to Harm (1 Corinthians 4:4; Matthew 15:14; Revelation 3:17)** We sometimes "*close our eyes*" spiritually to avoid pain or uncertainty, leading to blindness. In what areas (personal, church, or relationships) might you be ignoring needs or God's



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1. vision? Discuss how leaders can avoid guiding others blindly.
2. **Distorted Vision (Ecclesiastes 5:7; Jeremiah 23:31-34; Acts 16:9-10)** Our perceptions can be upside-down until God corrects them. Recall a time when a "*false vision*" (from dreams, words, or culture) misled you. How did God's Word realign your perspective, like it did for Paul?
3. **Restoring Vision (Hebrews 4:12; Psalm 119:18)**  
Double vision leads to division, but God's singular vision brings mission. What step will you take this week to reject distortions and seek clarity? As a group, pray:  
*"Open our eyes to behold wondrous things in Your law."*

**Action Step:** Journal one Bible verse from the sermon daily. Share insights in your next meeting. Let's turn vision into mission!



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
