THIS SUNDAY AT ST. JOHN'S

❖ Today is the Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost. The Season after Pentecost (the long, green season also commonly known as Ordinary Time) begins following Pentecost Sunday and ends on Christ the King Sunday, November 23, 2025. This season focuses on discipleship and the teachings of Jesus. Our Gospel texts come from Luke.

SERVICE NOTES

- ❖ A printed cross + is an invitation to make the sign of the cross on your forehead or body. We make the sign of the cross to remember our Baptism and the promise: "You have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever."
- **Bold print** indicates a speaking part for the whole assembly.
- * Restrooms are located in the Narthex to the right of the front door and through the doors behind the choir to the left.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MATT HANSEN

People of St. John's:

Most of us can remember school lunchrooms, where perhaps there was the "cool kids" table, and then there were all the other tables. Some of us were desperate to be invited over. Some of us never stood a chance.

In this week's Gospel text, Jesus steps into that same dynamic. He notices how people angle for the seats of honor, the ancient version of the "cool kids' table."



At Christ's table, however, things are a bit different. Popularity and pride fade. The only requirement is need. And the truth is, we *all* need Jesus. Martin Luther's dying words say it perfectly: "We are all beggars. This is true."

In Holy Communion, we come forward not because of our status or accomplishments, but because Christ welcomes us into this feast of forgiveness.

So let's take our place, not with pride but with humility, knowing that in Jesus, the tables have turned, and there's room for everyone. Rankings matter not. We all need Jesus.

"The Lord is my helper;


I will not be afraid.




