Prayers of the People

Have you ever wondered where the specific examples come from in the Prayers of the People? For example, last Sunday we prayed for stray dogs on the outdoor worship service we just so happened to have our pet blessing. And breaking news events find there way into the weekly prayers, which are always changing, too.

The prayers of intercession, or prayers of the people, are available through the website SundaysandSeasons.com. Prayers may provide spaces for our administrator, Jess, to add specific names, events, or ministries depending on the week. Sometimes this can be a prayer for conflicts to end and ecosystems to be protected. Other times it is a call for leaders to act in the best interest of the people.

For the leaders of towns, cities, provinces, states, and nations (leaders may be named), we pray. Guide them to enact equitable laws and policies for all. On this Labor/Labour Day weekend, make us mindful of workers whose labor often goes unnoticed.

How does our administrator fill in the blanks? Jess watches the news. A lot. Maybe a little too much. She's on top of what happens throughout the day and week. When accidents or conflicts erupt, she notes them for the prayers that Sunday.

When other prayer opportunities open up that she's not immediately familiar with, she hits the internet and does some research. She likes to reach across the globe to issues we might not be readily aware of so they can get prayed over, too. For example, a couple weeks ago we prayed over threatened ecological areas. Jess searched for "most endangered ecosystems" and some of the results surprised her (even for being an outdoorsy person). It was great to learn more about new places and pray over them. Now, prayers for healing come from members of our church, through our <u>online prayer requests</u>, and from our prayer box. Pastor compiles those into our bi-weekly prayer list and Jess works to put new names added into the Sunday prayers as timely as soon possible. For people who receive on-going care, she does her best to rotate names on a regular basis.

It's a little extra work, but one that she feels is important for the broader, global community to help make sure no one is forgotten.

Some of the Lakota People We Met and Learned From



Kevin Poor Bear created beautiful pieces of art using pastels and paper while sharing hardships about life on the reservation and hope for the future.

Basil Brave Heart welcomed us into the Ceremonial House and spoke with us for 2.5 hours about topics ranging from Lakota traditions to Quantum Physics.





Oglaga Lakota College Archivist Valerie Janis brought historical pieces to life with academic explanations and personal stories.

Staff from Red Cloud Renewables gave us a tour of energy efficient houses. The company trains solar panel technicians and has a class that is just for women to be able to get into the field!




Pine Ridge Youth Trip

Virgil was our guide at Wounded Knee and Wind Cave. He invited us to breath sage and give tobacco at the burial ground. He invited us to step down and feel the wind coming out of the cave.







Darren introduced us to two bison. (Yes, there was a fence between us and the wild animals). Darren had been a teacher and school superintendent on the reservation before he retired.

Kim was our guide from the Reconciliation Center. She took us to Badlands National Park, Oglala Lakota College, Artspace, and the Heritage Center (and Catholic Church) at Red Cloud School. She also gave us insight into a mom's life on the reservation.
