Reflection

Sensual and Spiritual Joys

Adam and Eve were placed in the Garden of Eden, meaning Garden of 'pleasure or 'delight!' It stands to reason that God thought we might enjoy our life with him and with each other.

The Letter to the Hebrews:

What you have come to is Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem where the millions of angels have gathered for the festival (Hebrews 12).

St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) taught that spiritual joys are deeper than sensual joys.

It is true that we can become too sensual, eating and drinking too much, or falling into sexual sin. But these failures do not annul the goodness of created and thus legitimate sensual joys.

A person of faith will appreciate these joys, but also be moved to enjoy the rich myriad of spiritual joys that are on offer in and through the spiritual life, especially the holy liturgy:

You have come to God himself, the supreme judge, and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

Goodness.

The saints, angels, Jesus and the Father are encountered during the Eucharist. **Amen.**

The Season of Creation is the annual Christian celebration to pray and respond together to the cry of Creation: the ecumenical family around the world unites to contemplate and care for our common home, the Oikos of God. The season's "Celebration" begins September 1, the Day which several Christian denominations celebrate as a World Day of Prayer for Creation and celebrated by some as the Feast of Creation and ends October 4, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, beloved by many Christian denominations. This year we will unite around the theme "Peace with Creation" with the symbol "Garden of Peace", inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18

At the heart of this symbol is a dove carrying an olive branch, bringing life and hope to the garden.


In the story of Noah, the dove returns to the ark with a fresh olive leaf, signalling the end of the flood and the beginning of renewal. The flood narrative begins with the earth "filled with violence" (Genesis 6:13), but the dove's return marks a divine promise of peace and restoration.


