
# Method and Meditation Guide August-September 2025 "110 YEARS...WITH CHRIST AT THE CENTER"

#### Hebrews 12:1-2 (NRSVue)

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

## Philippians 1:3-6 (NRSVue)

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. # August 25-31, 2025 Faith Through the Storms

- □ Aug 25 (Mon): Read John Wesley's Covenant Prayer. (You Might Remember this from Worship the First Week of January.)
- □ Aug 26 (Tue): Add 10 minutes of quiet time with God.
- □ Aug 27 (Wed):Attend the New Class, "Before Amen" about Prayer Led by Randy and Melissa Van Der Pol at 5:30 PM in Room 136.
- □ Aug 28 (Thu): Sing a hymn at home (Bonus: Charles Wesley hymn).
- ☐ Aug 29 (Fri): Read Psalm 23 slowly & thank God for each phrase.
- ☐ Aug 30 (Sat): Write down 3 things you're grateful for.

Aug 31 (Sun): Reflect on how God has been faithful to the First United Methodist Church of Gilbert over 110 years.

"The best of it is, God is with us." John Wesley, repeated variations of this phrase as he was in the final stages of dying. His final act was lifting his dying arms in a gesture of victory and repeating the phrase once more.

#### **Wesley Covenant Prayer**

"I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing.

I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

## Psalm 46:1–3, 10–11 (NRSVue)

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. ... Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth. The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.


#### Mark 4:35-41 (NRSVue)

On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

#### Prayer:

Loving God, in times of fear and uncertainty, remind us that you are our refuge and strength. When the storms of life overwhelm us, calm our hearts with your peace. Give us faith to trust in your presence, courage to act in love, and hope that you are always with us, guiding and protecting us.

## 1 Corinthians 3:6–9 (NRSVue)

#### Jeremiah 29:4–7 (NRSVue)

Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. Also, seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.

### Matthew 28:18–20 (NRSVue)

And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

#### Prayer:

God of our town and our lives, send us into Gilbert as your hands and feet. Teach us to seek the welfare of our neighbors, to serve with humility, and to share the good news of Christ's love. Empower us to make disciples, to teach your ways, and to live as a church committed to blessing the community you have placed us in. Amen.
