

Pastor's Page

You and I are living in the middle of a revolution, actually in the middle of the fourth of many revolutions. Let me explain. In the First Industrial Revolution. back in the 1700's the steam engine changed how our world works, starting in England and spreading across the globe. With the Second Industrial Revolution, electricity literally lit up a new world. Then again in our lifetimes, in the 1990's the Third Industrial Revolution, the computer changed what we can do and how fast we can do it. And now with artificial intelligence, biotechnology, autonomous vehicles, we are beginning a Fourth Revolution which will again change our lives and our world. If anything the changes seem be accelerating. So how does that make you feel? Excited? Scared? Uncertain? A mix of all of those? Me too. So how do we live faithfully in an age of deep, profound change?

One of the refrains I often here from folks both inside and outside the church is how unbalanced the world seems right now. Old norms and standards seem to go by the wayside almost daily. It is hard, almost impossible to keep up.



How do we know what to hang on to and what to let go of? How do we stay balanced in an unbalanced world?



Take a look at the picture above. What do you see? It's kind of cool, right? Do you notice it is not symmetrical? Yet it is still balanced.

The Christian faith has a long history in a changing world. It has faith practices and wisdom to teach us how to manage the change and stress we are feeling. Join us this fall as we begin a four week worship series called ReBalancing on how we can rebalance our lives

in an unbalanced world. God does not call us to retreat from the world or to hide from its problems, but to engage it. Romans 12: 2 puts it this way: *Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.* Join us for each of the four Sundays in September as we learn to rebalance.
