### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **Youth and Associate Pastor Update**

We are thankful that David Smith has volunteered to lead the youth on Wednesday nights until the time that we acquire an Associate Pastor. A person or two wondered if the entire youth program was on hold- and nothing could be farther from the truth. Thank you David and all the volunteers who love our youth and give of themselves for the Kingdom of God.

Please pray for the Staff Parish Relations
Committee as they seek to fill this important position. We will be moving from a part-time youth director to a full-time Associate Pastor.

It has been many years since we had an Associate Pastor but the SPR Committee believes the time is right to add this staffing position. This person's duties will include leading the Youth as well as assisting in various other areas of the church including pastoral care.

#### **Opportunities to Serve**

I always enjoy leading our Exploring Membership class for people who are interested in learning more about our church and what it means to be a full member.

By the way, the next class is Sunday, September 28 at 3 pm in the Crossroads Center.

One of the things I cover in that class is ways that people can get involved is serving in the church. We believe that every person who is able should volunteer and look for ways to serve. These include physically demanding tasks (like helping with the grounds-keeping in the summer heat) to things that are physically easy- but important, none the less.

I like to tell the class the story of Mr. Troy Thurmond. He was a petite man with serious lung problems and who always had an oxygen bottle with him. Before he passed away, while there were many things he could not do, he gave of

himself to sharpen pencils. To many people, this would seem like an insignificant job, but (as I say in my class) they don't get sharpened by fairies at night! Someone has to do it- and Troy gave of his time to make it happen.

So here is the list I present to the class of broad areas where people could volunteer their time in the life of the church- serving others in the Kingdom.

Nursery workers- we have paid staff, but sometimes need helpers.

Youth Ministry (Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights)

(Anyone working with Children or Youth must attend 6 months, pass background check)

Men's group / 8th Ave Methodist Men

Women's group / Women's Service Group

Prayer groups on Wednesday mornings

Wednesday night Community Dinners setting up, cleaning

Teachers for Sunday school and small groups

Visiting shut-ins

Preparing and serving food for funerals.

Repairs at church, painting. (The needs are huge in a facility like ours.)

Mission Team repairs at people's houses here or other states in disasters

Yarn Ministry- knitting & crocheting for needs in our church and community

Photography of events

Clean and straighten up after Worship

Providing meals for funerals

And this is not a complete list but rather broad areas where someone might serve.

Lastly, here are a few thoughts on budgeting and tithing. Scripture often speaks of offering the "first fruits" of our labor (Proverbs 3:9). In practical terms, this means setting aside our tithe before we pay bills or spend on ourselves. It reframes tithing not as "what's left over," but as an act of trust that God will provide for our needs when we honor Him first.

Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). A budget is like a mirror for the heart—it reveals what we value most. When we take a good look at where our money goes, we can quickly see what we love and where we place our trust. This can be both convicting and inspiring, especially when we align our spending with our values.

A budget is simply a plan for how we will steward what God has entrusted to us. Just like prayer and Bible study, it can become a spiritual discipline. When we budget, we remind ourselves that every dollar has a purpose and that our giving is not an afterthought—it's built into the very structure of our lives. 


Learn what is going on in the Crestview Christian community!
