
WHAT SPIRITUAL LEGACY ARE YOU LEAVING BEHIND? There are four (4) annual programs conducted to help enhance and encourage the women:

They represent approximately one hundred and seventy-five thousand members of the Christian faith community.

She is making history as the first female minister to head our auxiliary as well as the first member of her home church to hold the same title.







