The word “world” [*kosmos*] could refer to the created order or the human world.

We should love this created world for what it is, a reflection of the glory of God.

It is absolutely staggering to understand the majesty and the glory and the wonder of God in the created order.

The order that you see in the created world, both in its scientific, microscopic form and in its macro form, as

**well as everything in between, is reflective of the glory
and the majesty of God.**

**We're not supposed to disdain the created world. While
we are not environmentalists, as such, we are
_____ of the Creator.**

**When we talk about not loving the world, we're not
talking about _____.**

We are not to love the invisible, spiritual system of evil!

**It is that evil order with all of its elements and all of its
components that work against the things of God.**

**2 In the language of Scripture, this definition of the world,
is Satan's _____ that opposes Christ and God.**

**The system of evil is just loaded with false prophets, the
purveyors of anti-God teaching.**

**When you define the world, what you're saying is a
system that is against Christ.**

**Satan involves all the unregenerate as children of
disobedience in the system. That, beloved, is the world.**
