

#### COUNCIL NEWS

Church Council met Monday, August 11, 2025.

The meeting was called to order and Concerns and Thanksgivings were shared. Concern for Pastor Seibold on the death of his wife, Ellie. Thanksgivings for a successful Shippensburg Fair Food Stand, and to John Drake for fixing the broken church office file drawer. Thanksgivings and appreciation to all those who helped with VBS. A meeting to review and begin planning for next year is to be scheduled. Thanks to the Memorial Outreach Ministry for supplying highlighter markers, and all those who helped attach the MLC information cards to the markers, for Chamber of Commerce welcome bags to SU students. Thanksgivings to Kathy Kerr and Nancy Fogelsanger for the beautiful duet on Sunday and their continued musical gifts to the church. And a reminder was shared for everyone to be welcoming our visitors to Memorial each week.

Devotions were led by Pastor Godfred with scripture from 1 Kings 19:11-14. Pastor Godfred asked the question "What are we doing here?" in relation to the scripture text. Pastor Godfred led the opening prayer.

Pastor Godfred reported that the Blessing of Students, educational professionals, and supplies will be on Sunday, August 17<sup>th</sup>. Pastor noted that Synod will give money for Campus Ministry. New members' class will begin Sunday, September 7<sup>th</sup>. Revision of the Wedding Policy is in the works; Funeral Policy should be reviewed as well.

Jane Motter was selected to fulfill the vacancy of the position of Deacon through December 2025. At the annual meeting in November, four deacons will be elected to the 2026 Church Council. Whoever gets the 4<sup>th</sup> highest number of votes will serve the final year of this position of Deacon's term. Mary asked that the Safety and Security Task Force contact Fire Chief Randy O'Donnell and look in to the maximum capacity of Fellowship Hall, the sanctuary, and the CAR. Signs should be posted stating this information.

Saturday, October 18<sup>th</sup> Council will hold a working retreat beginning at 9:00 am to complete the edits and additions to the Ministries and Organizations of Memorial Lutheran Church Handbook. The homework for each Council representative is to attend their ministry committees' meeting(s), working with those committee members to edit their committee's page(s). The updated page(s) are to be brought to the retreat. To date, only five committees have submitted their pages.

Worship & Music Ministry discussed the issue of members not realizing until Sunday mornings that they are scheduled as a worship helper continues. There are multiple ways that this information is shared: the monthly volunteer schedule is included in the newsletter - which is emailed, posted on our Memorial's Facebook page, copies available for members to pick up at church, and mailed to homes of those who have requested delivery by post; the Volunteer schedule is also posted on Amy's office door, and is included in each Sunday's bulletin Weekly Call. We ask that if you have volunteered to serve as a worship helper, please make note of the dates you are scheduled. If you have a conflict with a date, let Amy know and contact someone else to cover for your Sunday.

Church Property reported that Wadel's will be contacted regarding the AC not working in Fellowship Hall. Dan Mast will be contacted to repair several lights that are not working. (The lights in the hallway outside of

Fellowship Hall/preschool room and mezzanine level elevator door opening ceiling lights.) Dan will also be consulted on changing all the lights in the Archives room to LED light fixtures. Other matters following up on are the pruning of the bushes by the retaining wall steps; contacting different contractors regarding options/ suggestions for the parking lot retaining wall. The Treasure reported that the increase in the organ fund is due to the excess in the organ relocation funding by donors. The moneys were distributed according to donor wishes as follows: \$5,000 to Archives and the rest to organ fund.

The setting up and moving in to the new Archives Room is progressing. Supplies are on order and shelving has been delivered. (Special thanks and appreciation to Sue Lyons and her grandchildren for getting all the shelving items to the room. (a) Antonio Diaz will be compensated for assembling the new shelving units. Matthew Creek will be in touch with the scouts' leaders to see if they can help with the moving of items up to the new Archives Room. A date will be made known when all is ready for the move.

The Women of the ELCA convention is Saturday, August 16<sup>th</sup> in Middletown. The Fair Stand reported a profit of \$6,000 from this year's event. The money was given to the church to be used where needed. Camp Nawakwa is beginning a major renovating and replacing campaign - stay tuned for further information. SPO has gotten 8 new carts to assist with their food distribution and organization.

## AD 2025 YEAR OF PRAYER

"Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." – Luke 11:1

Throughout the year, we have been talking about prayer and the importance of praying together, not just as a congregation, but as individual disciples of Jesus Christ. As Summer comes to an end and church activities resume, I would like to draw your attention to the fact that Christian prayer is an important activity in our Christian life. In fact, it is that which holds our relationship with God. Christian prayer may be spontaneous or scripted.

Prayer is a spiritual communication and a two-way relationship with God involving confession, thanksgiving, supplication, and adoration. Prayer can be expressed in both oral and mental form, in public or private settings, and even in songs, such as Psalms. Through prayer, we attune to God's will, cultivate a relationship, and express our needs and desires to a listening God who may respond according to His will and plans for us. Let us cultivate and nurture our prayer lives as disciples of Jesus Christ because prayer works.



#### The Impact of Prayer

*Personal Peace*: Christ is our peace, and there is a great sense of comfort and peace that comes with prayer. A great sense of feeling his presence, being heard by a loving and abiding God – Philippians 4:6-7.

*Prayer changes us*: As we seek the Lord and regularly spend time in His Word and with Him, we are transformed. His will supersede our desires, and we are able to say with Jesus, "Thy will be done," as our thoughts align more closely with His. As our understanding of his character deepens through our prayerful relationship, we learn how to pray in accordance with His will.

Prayer strengthens our community: When prayers take place within a community, such as a church or family, it strengthens and renews the bond among the members, regardless of the challenges they face. As the adage goes, "a family that prays together stays together."

We are excited to announce that our new full-time Executive Director will begin September 1. When we received a grant to fund the position from the Partnership for Better Health, we posted the new position and received 52 applications. After an intensive review and series of interviews, our hiring team selected Jennifer Crostley as our new director. Coming to us with 20 years of experience in non-profit positions including program director, Jennifer has the vision and skills to take SPO into the next phase of our strategic planning as we continue to grow and look to SPO 2030.

How SPO loves the abundance of the growing season!

The gleaning season is in full swing. SPO is receiving watermelons, cantaloupes, corn and peppers from our local gleaner and growers. Local gardeners have donated their excess produce. Otterbein United Methodist Church delivered 400 half-dozen ears of corn that they have grown, harvested, and bagged for us. If you or someone you know has extra vegetables or fruit, we invite you to drop them off at SPO any Tuesday before noon to be distributed later in the day. We are so blessed to be able to share this abundance with our neighbors.



We are grateful to our local grocery stores (Walmart, Giant, Weis, Aldi's) for their weekly food donations. With the closing of Circle of Love, SPO has added the Newville Weis store to our store donation pickups every Monday. While looking forward to this additional partnership, we are also in need of drivers to support this food recovery effort. If you, or someone you know is available, please reach out to us.
