What's This Life About Anyway?

If this earthly life was represented by a straight line, drawn on a piece of paper, where would you place yourself? The far left is the starting point, and the far right is the end. Recently, after looking at some old family photos, I placed myself about three-quarters along the line to the right. And, in doing so, asked myself, "What is this life about anyway?" We are born, we live for a few years, and we die. The middle part – our brief, few years – are referred to by some as 'the dash'. The idea is captured in the poem by Linda Ellis:

"I read of a man who stood to speak at the funeral of a friend. He referred to the dates on the tombstone from the beginning...to the end.

"He noted that first came the date of birth and spoke the following date with tears, but he said what mattered most of all was the dash between those years.

"For that dash represents all the time that they spent alive on earth.

And now only those who loved them know what that little line is worth."

But what about the dash? What are its years all about? We hear the answer every week in the Summary of the Old Testament Law: "Our Lord Jesus Christ said, 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: You shall love your neighbour as yourself."

For the Christian, the dash – the purpose of life – is all about offering ourselves to God in love. Why? Because He first loved us

through His Son, Jesus Christ. The lives of the Saints remind us that this is our purpose. For example, St. Aidan, Missionary and Bishop in the 7th century (remembered by the Church on August 31st) wrote this poem, expressing His desire for God:

"Leave me alone with God, as much as may be.
As the tide draws the waters close in upon the shore,
Make me an island, set apart. Alone with you, Oh God, Holy to You.

Then, with the turning of the tide, prepare me to carry your presence to the busy world beyond. The world that rushes in on me.

Til the waters come again, and take me back to You. "

What is this life about? The Westminster Catechism of the Church of Scotland, gives this simple answer: "Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever."
