

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD


If wisdom— as described in the first reading— is seeing things as they really are, then knowing our place in social situations reflects that wisdom. Jesus notes that those who strive to claim places of honor lack humility and, thus, wisdom. Without knowing who else is coming, they lay claim to seats that may be reserved for other guests.


If you choose a lower seat of honor and the host does not move you, you are saved from embarrassment. Moreover, your wisdom in choosing the lower seat would reflect positively upon your social awareness. On the other hand, if the host does move you to a higher seat, your humility is commended, and your honor is increased in being singled out by the host in this way.

Yet one should be wary of false humility. In the scenario that Jesus presents, false humility would be demonstrated by the person who chooses the lower seat of honor with the expectation of being moved to a higher position. Instead, wisdom guides us to the awareness of the reality that we most likely merit the lower seat. We ought to accept our limitations and focus on enjoying the feast and appreciating the company of those around us, rather than focusing on our perceived status. This focus on others is emphasized in Jesus' concluding remarks that encourage us to give to those who cannot repay us. We will then receive a spiritual, not earthly, reward. —Maria E Barga, PHD, MPHIL, MA
