# Father's Corner



## The Pursuit

We can't help but be in pursuit of something greater. It's written on our hearts by the creator of the universe. Whether it's remodeling our home, seeing your kids succeed at academics and athletics, or getting too competitive at family board games - fundamentally we know there's improvement to be made, something more incredible to be acquired.

"Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize? Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one. Thus I do not run aimlessly; I do not fight as if I were shadowboxing. No, I drive my body and train it, for fear that, after having preached to others, I myself should be disqualified."

- 1 Corinthians 9:24-27

On a very basic level, it's good for us to see that this is universal. This proof of God's design and plan for us is somehow visible in every human being, whether we acknowledge Him or not. This is evidence that we all have something essential in common. Even as we compete and fight with one another, somehow we're witnessing to something that is written in our nature.

Once we can name this reality, it's important for us to do some evaluating and examining: What am I actually pursuing? What's my goal here? The answers to those questions are key for us to understand if we are in the pursuit of something (or someone) actually great or if we're sacrificing family, relationships, and our own well-being for things that don't ultimately matter.

We are incredibly privileged as Christians and as Catholics to have the destination clearly marked and the Way (Jesus Christ himself) fully provided. He entered into our humanity, so that each and every day we are able to keep our eyes fixed on Him. Not only that, He has given us resources for every stage of the journey or race in the sacraments. The more we go to Him and take advantage of the sacraments, the more we are equipped.

First among those sacraments is the Eucharist, since in the Eucharist we have Jesus Himself humbly and fully given. He makes himself this accessible so that we access Him. Our pursuit needs to be Him who pursues us.

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary or lose heart."
