Dear Siblings in Christ,

When I started serving with Community of Good Neighbors in August of 2021, my goal – our collective goal – for this ministry was to advocate for and share resources with our brothers and sisters on the East Side of Buffalo. Food disparity has long been a part of this community's fabric, as it is in many areas throughout the country. Today, with an administration that appears to be committed to discontinuing over half the services provided to our neighbors, the need has grown even greater. Restricting access to food is demeaning, as well as potentially devastating to the most vulnerable in this community.

Food insecurity isn't just a statistic — it's a reality for too many of our neighbors on the East Side of Buffalo. Since August 2021, the Community of Good Neighbors has been advocating for and sharing resources with our East Side community.

Through generous donations from supporters like you, we have remained a consistent and steady presence in the community, providing non-perishable items and fresh produce and prayers, counseling, and comfort to those most in need. Unfortunately, the Community of Good Neighbors is facing significant financial constraints, putting the assistance we currently provide to over 300 families at risk.

As a synodically organized mission, we are limited in who we can seek funding from. We need your help in caring for people as Jesus called us to do! If every church in the Niagara Frontier Conference donated \$100, we would be able to sustain our ministry by purchasing essential food items and sharing space with our new community partners at Pilgrim St. Luke UCC.
