Relief for Human Need Worldwide

The Salem Mission Team and Sunday School will again work together to collect school supplies for the Lutheran World Relief School Kit project.

The collection tote and poster will be set-up in the church narrhex beginning on August 18th, 2024 - "Rally Sunday".

We will be collecting supplies through August and September and then assemble the kits during the Sunday School hour in late September.

If you are able to help out by purchasing any of the supplies listed it will be greatly appreciated. If anyone wishes to make a monetary donation to the LWR School Kit project the Salem Mission Team will use the donation to purchase the items for the kits. Checks can be made out to Salem Lutheran Church Women with a note "for the LWR School Kits".

Each LWR School Kit contains the following items:

- (4) 70 sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper-not loose leaf paper
- (1) 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side & inches on the other
- (1) Pencil sharpener
- (1) Pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- (5) Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- (5) Black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- (1) Box of 24 crayons
- (1) 2-1/2" eraser



August is a great time to purchase school kit items as most of these items are on sale in August and early September.

Please note that the items in the kits are very specific per Lutheran World Relief guidelines so that each student receives the same supplies.

Salem Lutheran Church Council Special Meeting Minutes August 7th, 2025

Attendance:

Salem Lutheran Church Council met on Wednesday, August 7th, 2025, at 6:30pm. Those in attendance included: Koni Lamprecht, Cortni Krusemark, Kevin Dohma, Saumbra Hall, Katie Uthof, Mark Bauman, Kenton Book, Duane Boyle, Lindsay Burrell, Dan Schweers, and Rick Schweers.

Call to Order

Co-President Koni called the meeting to order at 6:32pm.

New Business:

Koni and Cortni reported that they had a Zoom Meeting with Larry on Monday and it went very well. The tentative plan remains in effect, in which Larry would hopefully be to Salem by September 7th, 2025, the Prodigal Sons would provide the music and that evening we would have our annual congregational picnic @ 5:00pm. Larry's obstacle currently is the sale of their home, in which he stated that they are willing to be very aggressive in the sale of it so that they can get to Salem as soon as possible.

Koni and Cortni have been in contact with our regional Deans; Doyle/LCMC and Fritz/NALC and Dr. Chris Croghan from Luther House of Study in Sioux Falls, SD in regards to our Mentorship Plan for a Student Minister at Salem Lutheran Church. With this plan it was determined that we would have a Congregational Mentorship Team consisting of; Todd Anderson, Tammy Book, Paige Hinz, Brad Hrouda, and Diane Smith. A motion was made by Kevin to approve the proposed Congregational Mentorship team and was seconded by Rick. MCU.

The plan would be to get Larry ordained by the LCMC upon his arrival and then upon his graduation he would be ordained by the NALC, which would result in his dual affiliation with the LCMC and NALC. In their conversations with Dr. Croghan it was decided that Dr. Croghan would lead our Worship Service on Sunday, August 24th, 2025, and following our Worship Service we would have a Congregational Orientation Meeting in regards to Larry's transition/plan at Salem.

At 7:21pm, the church council moved into executive session to discuss personnel matters. A motion was made by Kenton and was seconded by Rick. MCU.

At 7:41pm, Koni/Co-Church Council President declared that the meeting shall exit the executive session and returned to the regular session.

As per the discussion in executive session, a motion was made by Mark and seconded by Koni. MCU.

As per the discussion in executive session, a motion was made by Rick and seconded by Duane. MCU.

Cortni reported that we had five interested applicants for the janitor/custodian position. Katie emailed each applicant an application to be completed and returned to the church by July 31, 2025. Of the five interested we received two completed applications back. Kevin made a motion to extend the janitor/custodian position to Ashely Uthof and was seconded by Kenton. MCU.

Katie shared that she needs to get the postcards ordered for the annual congregational picnic and wanted to confirm that the date will be Sunday, September 7th, 2025. Everyone agreed that yes, we will hold the picnic on September 7th, 2025. It will be potluck style as in years past and the Church Council will be responsible for the meat/buns/condiments/paper products/drinks. Typically, we plan for 90ish people. Duane and Kevin will bring hamburger buns, Rick will

bring hot dog buns, Mark will bring hamburgers, Lindsay will bring hot dogs, Dan will bring ketchup/mustard/pickles, and everyone else will bring a side dish or dessert. Cortni confirmed that her parents will make homemade ice cream, and the youth group will be in charge of the games

Katie reported that Julie provided the following estimates:

Murph's in Vermillion, SD to repair the ice machine in the south refrigerator for approximately \$400.00. A motion was made by Kenton and was seconded by Kevin. MCU.

Lowe Project's LLC, Laurel, NE to repair miscellaneous items (sanctuary ceiling repair/refinishing, repair of corner bead spots throughout) in the church/sanctuary. A motion was made by Mark and seconded by Dan. MCU.

The Church Council also commended Kenton and Juile for all their work in getting the parsonage ready to go, as well as thanking Cortni and Koni for all their efforts with Larry's transition to Salem.
