Spending three months on sabbatical, away from my regular responsibilities as your pastor here at Prince of Peace, gave me the opportunity to "return to the ground" of my being – the God who created and loves me. Thank you for allowing me the space to make the most of that opportunity and for welcoming me so warmly home when I returned in August! I am delighted by all the stories I've heard about VBS and camp and building improvements and changes, and the many and various ways you encountered God over the summer. I can't wait to hear even more!

Here are three of the ways I encountered God and stood on holy ground this summer:



My first sabbatical stop was at Holy Wisdom Monastery in Middleton, WI, for a Deep Breath retreat. I hiked in their beautiful woods. I prayed three times a day and ate delicious meals with the small community of sisters who make up the ecumenical monastic community there. I read, wrote, drew, and rested. God's still small voice called to me through the quiet and peace of this place and its people. I felt the tensions that had built up over the COVID years and the stresses of car accidents and tornadoes beginning to loosen.

Reconnecting with friends was one of my goals for this time of renewal and grounding. While each visit held its own strong sense of grounding and connection, I was most struck by this sense of God providing for me my whole life long when visiting with Brenda and Violet (my eldest godchild). Brenda was a member of my mom's first call (St. Paul Lutheran Church, Frankfort, IN) and the two became close through their love of art. Watching over Brenda's cat and later her children where my first jobs as a teenager. Even though our family moved to a new town when I was in high school, we stayed in touch.





When she knew I'd be passing near Frankfort while on sabbatical, Brenda reached out and said she had something to give me. She had used my image in a series of artwork she created for a local show and wanted me to have the piece. Violet snapped a picture of me holding it and Brenda holding a painting my mom made of her elder daughter, Lauren, some 20+ years ago. It was a big God moment!



Social Concerns

Social Concerns Update.

Our Food Distribution program is a very active way that Prince of Peace helps our community friends on the first and third Thursdays of each month.

The Food truck arrives between 12:30-12:45, food is stacked on pallets ready to distribute to waiting registered customers, in rain, snow, sleet, or hopefully sunshine. People line up in cars, on bikes or they walk up, sometimes with a wagon or we supply them with rolling carts, courtesy of Lynne Wathen. Currently 150 boxes of fresh food, which we purchase from the Southwest Michigan Food Bank, is handed out on each of the Thursdays.

It's not too late to sign up to help on God's Work. Our Hands. See the sign up in the Gathering Space or just stay to help on Sunday, September 7.



At almost every distribution breads, rolls, bagels and pastries are available which the Food Bank also brings. You might be interested to know what is in each box, which is filled to the top. All of the items are fresh or dried, and have included apples, peaches, pears, plums, peppers, celery, onions, potatoes, raisins, walnuts, dried beans, cheese, butter, milk, cereals, and many other surprises. During harvest seasons, especially in the fall, we receive additional healthy produce. Recently we received 800 pounds of green beans, 400 pounds of corn and 400 pounds of tomatoes. Our friends are especially happy to pick up these extras.

As you can see this takes many hands to bag produce, put boxes in cars, direct cars and register guests. If you can help, sign up or show up at 12:30. We have made many friends and look forward to greeting them in the line up.

Adult Faith Formation

Who was MARTIN LUTHER?



Reformer, rebel, priest, pastor, heretic, professor, man of faith, man of doubts...all of these descriptors have been applied to him. We will share the story of this man who is credited with the birth of the Lutheran Church and the Protestant Reformation.

Having had the awesome privilege of traveling to Germany numerous times and visiting virtually all the sights relevant to Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation, I look forward to sharing the story of Luther's life and the roots of the Reformation For four **Sundays in October** we will travel with the use of photos to most of these sights. As we do so we will also discuss many of our core Lutheran doctrines and their Biblical foundations. We will share the story of Luther's marriage and the important role Katharine von Bora had in his life. We will look at some of the legacies around Luther's life. What was the world like during his time? What issues did he have with the Pope and Roman Catholic Church? What still are points of difference?

Plan to join us for this fun and informative journey. Please bring your curiosity and questions. No one will be put on the spot so you need not be concerned about that.

We will meet during the Faith Formation time at 9:15am in the Flex room.

Sharing Faith

At Prince of Peace, we are well acquainted with telling stories and listening to stories, especially stories of how we have experienced God at work in, with, through and around us. We call them "God Moments". Put these moments together and we have a living library full of divine stories, stories of faith.

Sharing Faith is a three-session-opportunity to recognize our own faith stories and share them with others. While each session leans on the one before, each is its own opportunity to recognize God-with-us, share with others and to be uplifted by the experience.

In Week 1, we explore what we believe and how we came to believe what we do.

In Week 2, we pick from a list of "beginnings" (prompts) to develop our stories and to discover other stories of when and how we experienced God's presence in our lives.

In Week 3, we will use our stories from previous sessions or from the times between sessions to explore and connect to the stories of others, especially stories or passages from the Bible, songs or hymns we have heard or sung in church, and even words of a sermon that touched our heart.

All are invited to share in this grace-filled exploration and sharing

Vacation Bible School was held during the first week of August, and we had a fantastic time!




On Monday, special guest Noah shared how he learned to trust God during the unknown. We measured out how big the ark was,


High School: We will look at all the ways life and faith overlap, exploring how everything intersects.




