Jesus Paid It All

Communication Column

Jesus was asked one time "what is important in life"? That is a little bit of a paraphrase but it captures the essence of what the expert in the law was asking Him in Matthew 22:34-40. He was asked "what is the greatest commandment," and it was asked in a spirit of trying to test Jesus. He knew this but He still answered the question. Why would He answer the question knowing that they were testing Him and trying to trap Him? Because the answer really was that important. His answer was "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it, 'love your neighbor as yourself."

Jesus was asked about the greatest commandment and Jesus answered by letting everyone know what was important in life. What is important is to love God and love people. Those things are what life is supposed to be about. We complicate life with so much stuff but life should be about loving God and loving people.

The very idea of love carries with it the idea of communion. We commune (or spend time with people that we love). In fact the word communion is defined as "the sharing or exchanging of thoughts and feelings, especially personal thoughts and feelings." Communion is an act of love and we are called by Jesus Himself to love God and to love other people.

Communion is also an act of worship in church. We partake of the bread and juice, which represents the body of Christ. Why did Jesus give His body and shed His blood on the cross? Simply put because He loved us and when we celebrate communion we are remembering in a very special and powerful way the sacrifice of Jesus on Calvary. I say we are remembering it is a special way because in reality we should remember Jesus' sacrifice and His love for us every time we gather for worship, but not just during worship, we should remember His love for us and His sacrifice on the cross each and everyday of our lives. Martin Luther instructed us correctly when he said, "Preach the Gospel to vourself everyday". We need to be reminded daily of the love of God and as we are reminded it should motivate us to commune with Him, not just as we take communion, but each and everyday. To quote the old hymn we should remember that "He walks with us and talks with us." We should remember and we should listen and share our thoughts and lives with Him as well. We love Him because He first loved us. We celebrate communion today because He gave us His love on the cross of Calvary.

Of course His love empowers us to love Him in return and it also empowers us to love one another. It empowers us to commune even with one another, to talk with one another, to listen to one another, and even to do what Paul says in Romans 12:15, and "weep and rejoice" together. His love makes all of that possible. This week we begin an exciting new adventure together and I am honored and thrilled to be your pastor. I can think of no better way to begin this new chapter than by worshipping together and celebrating communion. This adventure will include us getting to know one another, loving and encouraging one another, praying for and perhaps praying with one another, and it will prayerfully include weeping and rejoicing with one another as well. All of these one another's and important and all of them are possible because the love of Jesus on the cross. We get to celebrate that love today as we take communion. So because of the love that He has for us let us love Him in return and let us love one another well for the glory of God and through the power of God.
