From Pastor Dave

September Winners, Stewards, & Generous Common Discoverers I received the following on August 21.

Dear Partners in God's Abundance.

Congratulations! Your congregation/ministry site is one of 120 ELCA organizations which will be receiving a \$1000 grant for the Feast of Abundance Program. This grant was made possible by a generous donation from the Stewardship of Life Institute; co-sponsors are Kindling Faith at United Lutheran Seminary and the ELCA Churchwide Office.

Here's some details you'll want to know:

- + A four-part Bible study on generosity is attached (based on Chris Anderson's wonderful book, "Infectious Generosity").
- + Your grant check should arrive no later than August 30th.
- + You have between September 7 and Christmas to host your event.
- + We ask that you send pictures of your event and a brief paragraph describing it that we can share on our social media.
- + Your event can be held anywhere in the vicinity of your ministry site. Be creative and work to benefit your community as best you can.

Again, congratulations! I pray your ministry is blessed with God's abundance!

It feels nice to "win" something! Yet, Jesus says in Luke 12:48 (which we heard in worship on Sunday, August 17) "From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded."

Some of St. Mark's Stewardship, Evangelism, and Council team members are visioning this Feast of Abundance. If you have some ideas or would like to be a part of this you may contact me or Bonnie Klos, Susan Bostian, Jan Wagoner, Mitch Abraham. I would like to see an event not just be for St. Mark's but expand outward toward our neighbors.

I'm reminded of Generosity stories throughout Luke's gospel account which we continue to read from in 2025 – Mary shares her womb with God; a Prodigal Father throws a feast for a lost, now found, son!; Jesus forgives and heals and feeds so many!; don't forget a merciful Samaritan; a Parable of the Great Dinner; a community celebration because a lost coin is found!; rich Zacchaeus gives abundantly to the poor!; a widow gives two small copper coins; bread is broken, wine is poured, and there is a sacrificially generous "new covenant in my blood."

There is also a story in Acts 10 of Peter (Jewish Christ-believer) and Cornelius (a "devout" Roman military officer). Both men make generous sacrifices in order to get to know each other and God better. There is "GUESTABILITY" – in that they were "guests" of each other, which led to "common discoveries." Peter is converted first, he's changed. Then, only after his conversion, is he able to share the gospel and convert Cornelius's family through baptism into Christ. But how they got there was through a **vision**, **invitation**, **conversation** (**like a Feast of Abundance**), leading to "Being with you is showing me there's something beyond us both, toward which we're each heading. Let's make our way there together." They became God's companions (bread sharers) through the Holy Spirit – guests, co-discoverers, en route to something ever more amazing!


Charitable Giving


study, every moment was filled with joy. The counselors were fantastic, and Grandma got to make some unforgettable memories with her boys.
