This fall, Monroe United Methodist Church will begin a new message series, Both/And: Finding God in the Tensions, where we'll explore how Jesus brings balance, belonging, and hope when life feels complicated.

Each week we'll tackle one of these reallife tensions:

When Your Heart and Head Don't Agree (Mark 12, Acts 8)

Where Is God in My Everyday Life? (Acts 10)

Longing to Belong (Galatians 3, Hebrews 13)

Is There Grace for Someone Like Me? (1 Timothy 1).

Whether you've been in church for decades or are just curious about faith, these messages will speak to the questions we all carry. Seniors will find encouragement as they reflect on faith through the seasons of life, while parents will hear hope for navigating the stresses of work, family, and raising kids.

Alongside worship, we'll also offer opportunities to grow in conversation and community. Small groups will dive deeper into each week's theme, and our worship team is preparing creative experiences to help us live into this "both/and" vision of faith. Our prayer is that everyone — from longtime members to neighbors just checking things out — will discover that God is bigger than the boxes we try to fit Him in.

Join us Sundays, starting Sept. 14 at 9:30 or 11:00 a.m. for this inspiring series. Come and see how faith can connect with your real life, right where you are.



# Making Our Church a Place Where Everyone Feels Welcome

What draws people to stay at a church? While solid preaching and good music matter, research shows that lasting friendships are what truly keep people coming

back. In our fast-paced world, genuine connections are becoming rarer and more precious than



ever. The good news is that friendliness doesn't happen by accident—it happens when we're *intentional*ly reaching out to others.

This September let's embrace the **G.I.F.T. Plan** together! Each week, challenge yourself to do just one of these simple acts:

- Greet someone you've never met before and learn their name;
- Introduce two people who might have something in common;
- Follow up with someone you met recently by saying hello again and including them in conversation; or
- Thank a volunteer or church member for something they've done. These small gestures create ripple effects that transform our entire church culture.

Imagine if everyone tried just one **G.I.F.T.** action each Sunday—what a difference we could make! You don't need to be an extrovert or have special training. Whether you're welcoming a first-time guest, connecting our

youth with teen mentors, or simply thanking someone who helpedin the kitchen, you're building the kind of loving community that reflects Christ's heart. Let's make this September a month where every person who walks through our doors experiences the warmth of Christian fellowship. Who will you G.I.F.T. this Sunday?

#### Learn to Help Disaster Survivors

An Early Response Training is taking place on November 8 at North Broadway UMC in Columbus. This 8-hour training will teach you how to assist survivors of natural disasters in

their time of need. You will learn how



to provide a Christian presence while taking steps to prevent further damage to the family's personal property; this may include tarping, debris removal, cleaning out flooded homes, etc. FEMA recognizes this training to enter a disaster scene.

A recertification class will also be offered that day. This class is for those who have completed the basic course and are within one year of the date their badge expiration. We will assign groups areas in the building to get a good cleaning and will work in about 2-hour shifts. I will have a list closer to the dates for signups to help.


We could possibly do a little outside cleaning with just cleanup and repairing the wooden fence and maybe a tree limb to remove.

## Board of Trustees

#### **Update from the Trustee Committee**

So far this year these are the projects we have been working on and where the maintenance funds have been spent.

#### Two of the big projects:

- New Projector for Atchley Hall was just completed this week at a cost of approximately \$9,000.
- Last week we completed the Air Conditioner in the Sanctuary at a cost of approximately \$10,750.
- This week we had to get a lift and replace a board that had fallen from the ceiling in Atchley Hall, and we also replaced light bulbs that needed to be replaced.

#### Smaller projects:

- New toilet in the nursery as the other one was leaking.
- Door into the Narthex closer was broken.
- Parsonage air conditioning needed repaired – approximately \$1,000 – also found out that the unit itself at the parsonage is a 2010 unit.

 Yearly fire inspection – we needed to replace some cords that were not being properly used and replace the timer on a lamp in the Narthex.

Fire inspection requires we have all fire extinguishers checked and up to date – so that will still be a cost coming this year and the compression hood in the kitchen must be checked twice a year – another cost we must have done. Along with those is an elevator inspection once a year and boiler inspections each year.

So, as you can see, there are always costs for maintaining the building even if it's not a huge amount. These are costs above the regular monthly bills of the church.

We ask that you not forget us when you make your offerings to the church.
