

Leaving It All On The Field - Week 4 Sermon Notes

Playing for Something Bigger

Backyard football = just playing around. On the field = you're playing for something bigger.

Championship teams leave it all on the field.

God didn't put you here to play it safe—He put you here to leave it all on the field for His Kingdom.

TRUTH #1: You Were Designed to Make a **Difference**

Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Jesus didn't just save us from something... He saved us for something.

You are God's **masterpiece** with a purpose.

You weren't made to warm a seat... you were made to move your feet.

Like a puzzle piece, you only make sense in the bigger picture.

<u>1 Peter 4:10</u> "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

I was created for good works. I am God's masterpiece.

TRUTH #2: Serving Is How We Live on Purpose

Every position matters on a football team—so it does in the church.

Matthew 20:28 "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."

If you're too big to serve, you're too small to lead.

Serving makes your faith come alive.

Serving is not about "getting fed"—it's about sharing what's on your plate.

Each of you has a gift to **serve** others. Jesus came to **serve**, not to be **served**.

TRUTH #3: Serve Like It's for God

Colossians 3:17 "Whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus..."

<u>Colossians 3:23–24</u> "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving."

Serving isn't about being seen—it's about **serving** the Savior.

Every act of service is an act of worship.

Changing diapers. Greeting at the door. Running sound. Mowing the lawn.

When we all serve, the church becomes stronger, deeper, and more impactful. When we don't it's incomplete and unable to reach it's full potential.

Whatever I do, I do it for the Lord. Serving is an act of worship.

Get in the Game

Discover your gift. (Take a SHAPE test)

Serve someone. Step into a role. Use what you've got.

Don't stay on the sidelines.

God's Kingdom will not be built by **spectator**, it's built by **servants**. Are you too busy building your own kingdom or worse someone else's?

The people remembered are not the ones who stayed <u>safe</u>, but the ones who gave <u>everything</u>.

You were shaped to serve God, by serving others.

Action Points

Serve with worship in mind. This week, pick one act of service (at home, work, or church) and intentionally do it "for the Lord" instead of recognition.
