From the Desk of Pastor Rob: "Back to School, Back to Work... Back to Life's Rhythm"

The last of the summer sunsets seem to come a little earlier now. The air, though still warm (or very hot and humid), carries a hint of crispness that whispers of autumn ahead. And for many of us, the calendar reminds us that vacation days are behind us, school supplies are bought, and alarm clocks are ready to ring again.

We are stepping back into the rhythms of school and work after a season of long evenings, family trips, and maybe a few "just one more swim" or "one more swing of the baseball bat" moments. The return can feel both refreshing and daunting. We've had time to rest and play—but now the pace quickens again.

This is part of the beautiful pattern of life that God has woven into creation: seasons of rest and seasons of work, times for play and times for purpose. Ecclesiastes tells us, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

Summer gave us the time to breathe more deeply. Now autumn calls us to take that renewed energy and put it toward learning, building, creating, and serving.

One temptation is to treat summer and the rest of the year as two separate worlds: one for fun, the other for seriousness. But what if we didn't have to leave the best parts of summer behind?

The joy of a picnic, the wonder of exploring a new place, the calm of a sunset—these are not meant to be locked away until next June. They are glimpses of God's goodness that can shape our daily lives. As we return to classrooms and office spaces, we can bring with us the spirit of curiosity, playfulness, and gratitude that summer cultivates.

For students, this means seeing the new school year as more than just "getting through" assignments—it is an invitation to grow, to discover new gifts, and to build relationships that will shape the future. For those returning to work routines, it's a chance to approach our tasks with fresh eyes, remembering that our work can be an offering to God and a way to bless others.

It's easy to imagine that God is most present in the quiet of a lakeside evening or the peace of a hammock nap. And yes, God is surely there. But God is also just as present in the early morning rush to catch the bus, the hum of meetings, the afterschool conversations at the dinner table.

In Psalm 23 we are reminded that God's presence follows us wherever we go—through green pastures and through the bustling valleys of everyday life. This means our return to "real life" after summer is not a step away from God's nearness but simply another setting in which God walks beside us.

As we move into this new season, our church also steps into fresh opportunities to serve and support one another. We pray for our children, teachers, and school staff as they begin another year. We look for ways to encourage those who are feeling the weight of their work responsibilities. And we commit ourselves to being a community where rest, joy, and purpose are woven together in the life of faith.

Let's embrace this season with open hands—bringing summer's joy into autumn's calling, trusting that the One who gave us rest will also give us strength for the work ahead.

May we remember that in every season—whether by the water's edge or in the middle of a busy day—God is with us, guiding us into life abundant.

Peace be with you all and let us enjoy this time together!
