

"Sing it, Church" Revelation 5- Songs of Summer series

1. Opening reflection:

The preacher shared how music has the power to shape us. What role has music—worship or otherwise—played in shaping your heart and outlook on life?

2. The tears of John:

John wept because no one was able to open the scroll. Have you ever faced a moment when you felt powerless to fix a situation? How did you respond in that season?

3. The Lion who is a Lamb:

John expected a conquering Lion but saw a slain Lamb. What does this surprising picture teach us about how God brings victory? How might it challenge our usual ideas of strength and success?

4. Trusting the Lamb:

If only Jesus is worthy to open the scroll, what does it look like for you to trust Him in the areas of your life that feel broken or out of control?

5. Joining the song:

The elders and angels break into worship because of what Jesus has done. What helps you enter into wholehearted worship—and what sometimes holds you back?

6. The scope of redemption:

The song celebrates that Jesus gave His life for people of every tribe, language, and nation. How can we live in ways that reflect God's wide, inclusive vision for redemption?

7. Living the song now:

The vision ends with every creature lifting their voice in praise. What are

some practical ways we can "add our voices" now—through worship, prayer, or action—as we wait for God's final restoration?

Closing Prayer:

"Jesus, You are the Lion and the Lamb. You alone are worthy. We bring You our tears, our hopes, and our lives. Help us to trust You, join Your song, and live as people of Your redemption. Amen."
