September 2025

From now until the first Sunday of Advent, we will be journeying through the book of Psalms. In her book Journey through the Psalms, Denise Dombkowski Hopkins describes the movement of the Psalms. She writes,

Walter Brueggemann suggests that we move from Psalm 1 to 50 "by way of the suffering voiced in the complaints and the hope sounded in the hymns." Lived experience intervenes between obedience and praise, and it is in this between place "where Israel mostly live ... the obedience of Psalm 1 and the praise of Psalm 150 are not simply literary boundaries but the boundaries for Israel's life and faith." As Renita Weems puts it, "this is the spiritual journey, learning how to live in the meantime, between the last time you heard from God and the next time you hear from God." The movement toward praise is punctuated by lurches into despair, but these are not faith relapses or aberrations. "Doubt and despair are not merely sidesteps in an otherwise optimistic faith. They are in fat integral to the faith experience." "Israel's lament is never simply an emotional outburst or an exercise in self-pity. It is a cry for relief from suffering so that God may once again be praised." (Hopkins, Journey through the Psalms, p. 3)

Over the next 12 weeks, we will be on this journey. While we won't read all 150 psalms in worship, we will spend time with Psalms of Praise, Lament, Thanks, and Trust. On September 7, we will begin our series by studying Psalm 1 and have a general overview of the Psalms. Together each week, we will recite the Psalms with the sung response from the Psalter found in the United Methodist Hymnal. Below is a brief outline of the Psalms we will be studying more closely through worship and Bible study.

Together, we will sing these songs of praise to God who is great and worthy of our praise.

From Our One Table Chair and Lay Leader:

We are to make a joyful noise unto the Lord. When we worship, we should sing praises to God, glorifying Him and honoring His Name. Music is a channel of divine blessing, comfort and strength. Even in the depths of suffering, we can turn our hearts and voices to God.

Someday we'll stand before our Lord singing and proclaiming all our praises to the King, with all the eloquence we've dreamed of having. For now, set within this earthly realm, we have music to give us a preview, a foretaste of glory divine. Music is a precious gift from God, planted in the depths of our souls, then set free from our lips to reach God in Heaven, to bring glory to His Name. God will always make a way, and one of the clearest and straightest roads to Him is the music He gives us.

Music after all is amazing. Studies seem to indicate that your potted plant grows more rapidly and robustly if Mozart is playing in the room. Can you doubt that you and I, created in the very image of God, will grow more like Him, and more quickly, when His melodies and His truths are the music that fills our lives? Music fills the world we live in, from radios in our cars to music in elevators, to birds singing at the crack of dawn, to organ music at baseball games, to downloaded music heard on over 150 million lpods sold as of one year ago, and on and on. We are wired for music, and I believe it is a true expression that brings glory to God. And it brings peace to our hearts.

Think about the importance of music in your own life? Music softens our hearts and allows God to speak to us. In Paul's letter to the Ephesians and a parallel passage to the Colossians he writes; "Be filled with the spirit, speaking to one another in Psalms and Hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another in the fear of God." Chapter 5 verses 18-21. Colossians 3:16 says, "Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

If you find yourself discouraged or depressed, try singing praise to the Lord or playing a worship CD. One thing I do is to play the piano or listen to cd's or You Tube, which helps me to center myself on God's word through hymns or gospel music. Some people listen to music when they walk or paint or just need to be with God through music.

Music has an incredible power that many people are unaware of. Discover the joy and encouragement that Godly music can add to your life! Read the Psalms and you will find music in many of them such as Psalm 150:1-6. To me, worship music makes a big difference in my home or in a workplace. It creates an atmosphere that welcomes the presence of the Holy Spirit and the peace that only God can bring. If you feel really daring and are steady on your feet, try dancing around as you sing for the feeling of joy and encouragement that the Lord brings to you during these times.

I know there are all kinds of music and some of it brings negative vibes but music that praises God energizes my spirit and truly soothes my soul.

A big thank you to all who brought special music to our worship services this summer that glorified our Lord. Your music brought a blessing to all.

We will be starting up choir and handbell choir again shortly. Our main issue is finding a time when we can have everyone together for the practice and not take you away from other things such as Sunday School, Bible study, and other things. I know everyone is very busy with family life of cheer, gymnastics, volleyball, basketball, scouts, work, and other things and we want to try to include all in the world of music.



DIRECTIONS: Use a different colored pencil or pen to trace each of the three forest animals to his favorite autumn food.




Find and circle the directions including vocabulary words in the grid. Look backwards and for them in all DIRECTIONS: diagonally.
