Church Council Minutes August 10, 2025

Called to order in the Parish Hall by President Don Hill at 10:59 am.

Opening Prayer by Pastor Hagerty

Pastor's Report

We continue to provide weekly worship resources to the congregation. They include:

- 1. In-person worship services are held at 10:00 am on Sundays.
- 2. YouTube worship videos are filmed and edited by Emory Bedenbaugh. Through August 10th, we have done 243 videos.
- 3. On-line bulletins and sermon transcripts in pdf format are emailed to the church family and hand-delivered to 22 household locations.

Worship video links are being emailed to our church family and posted on our website of: www.stthomaschapin.com. They are also posted to our St. Thomas Facebook page and boosted to the Chapin area.

We had Holy Communion by intinction on August 3rd. Our in-person worship attendance for July was 55. We averaged 50 views per week on YouTube for our pre-recorded Sunday worship videos.

Other activities include:

1. Confirmation class and Sunday School classes resumed today after taking a ten (10) week break for the summer.

- 2. Our Young at Heart (YAH) seniors' group will meet on Monday, August 18th at 10 am to car pool to Shealy's BBQ for lunch,
- 3. The 2025 Dutch Fork Cluster Beach Retreat at the Isle of Palms Coastal Retreat Center took place June 19th to June 22nd. An article by Dan Koon of Bethlehem Lutheran Church was included in our August newsletter
- 4. We worked with Bethel Lutheran Church to provide a Vacation Bible School from July 20th through the 24th at St Thomas using the "Road Trip" curriculum. Twenty-two children enjoyed the VBS. Total attendance was between 60 and 70 people. Each day started with a meal at 5:30 pm and the program was held from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm. We had the Rev. Dr. Bobby Morris to be our speaker for our VBS adult class on the first two evenings. The next three nights had Road Trip presentations by Pastor on Ireland; Beth Ervin on Greece; and Roger Edwards on the United States.
- 5. Pastor is continuing to pursue Church Fuel coaching with Elizabeth Hill, now that VBS is behind us. We are working on purpose and mission statements using their twopage plan.
- 6. A children's birthday party will be held at our picnic shelter on Saturday, August 23rd at 2:00 pm. Our neighbor, Brett Auckland has signed the guideline form and is the person responsible for making sure that the picnic shelter is left as it was found.
- 7. Lacy suggested that we create a guideline form for the use of the fellowship hall. It should include a line item for people to bring their own ice, especially since we recently had to repair the ice maker following an

event in the fellowship hall. Don suggested that the Property Committee review the picnic shelter form and create a form for the use of the fellowship hall.

8. Old business is to discuss the three resolutions passed at the SC Synod assembly.

Treasurer's Reports

The Consolidated Fund Activity Report shows that we ended the month of July with a current operating fund balance of \$86,203.03. Our current operating fund expenses during the month of July were **\$21,524.64.** Our July receipts were \$21,680.76. We are still off to a very good start after the first seven (7) months of 2025. Our YTD giving to the current fund through the first seven months of 2025 is \$149,298.76. Our giving to the current fund in the first seven months of 2024 was \$124,779.30.

The July 2025 consolidated activity report includes the following designated fund totals: Capital improvement fund: \$13,469.39 Sanctuary enhancements fund: \$20,684.58

Cemetery fund: \$355.43

Social Ministry / Outreach Fund: \$656.37

STLC Youth Fund: **\$3,442.28** JLB Endowment Principal Bal-

ance: \$83,674.39

JLB Endowment Interest Bal-

ance: \$27,553.94

JLB Loan Balance: **\$24,910.63**

VBS: **75.00**

Don addressed the payroll clearing account #2999 question from last month's council meeting. This account is listed under liabilities and is cleared out quarterly. We may need further clarification and details from Jennifer.

The asterisks in the treasurer's report indicate when an income or expense line item exceeds the "pro-rated" budget amount. Pastor pointed out that this works well for our electricity expenses, showing how we are doing on that monthly expense. The prorated budget amount does not work very well for things like VBS, where we are done spending for the year after 8 months. The asterisk is also not relevant for one-time expenses like copyright coverage.

Stewardship and Finance

Stewardship and Finance Committee discussed via email and recommend the following to Council:

- 1. Cemetery Budget Item create budget item for cemetery expenses (new budget line item would cover expenses such as flags, veteran markers, sand, etc.; currently, cemetery committee has no budget for such items...they fund these expenses using the cemetery memorial fund); note Cemetery memorial fund will continue
- Grounds/Landscaping Contract Expenses

 consolidate cemetery grounds/
 Landscaping contract expenses under property committee (currently, cemetery designated fund used to fund part of these expenses)
- 3. VBS Designated Fund create VBS designated fund (allows individuals to directly support VBS through memorials; eventually, fund will provide financial cushion in case expenses are above what was budgeted in a given year); note in the past, VBS was a separate budgeted item.

- Council voted unanimously to approve the above recommendations from the S&F Committee.
- 4. In a previous Stewardship & Finance meeting back in January all members of the committee present agreed that we should recommend to Council to fund the annual payment to the JLB loan (\$4,000), and to fund the annual budget amount to the Parking Lot maintenance fund (\$1,000).
- 5. "Unfortunately, as the Council Rep to the Stewardship and Finance Committee, I failed to bring this recommendation to Council for approval at that time. Both payments are already in the approved budget for this year (account #5308 and #5309, respectively). As such, I recommend we move forward with funding the \$4,000 JLB repayment and \$1,000 parking lot maintenance fund."—Don Hill.
- 6. Council voted unanimously to approve the recommendation and to create a designated fund for parking lot maintenance. The \$1,000 that we have budgeted will be transferred to that new parking lot maintenance designated fund by the end of the year.
- 7. Finally the S&F committee will work with Jennifer to send out a copy of each committee's budget for the current year (2025) to use as a starting point for 2026. All committees are requested to get their budget requests in to the S&F Chair, Ron Derrick (and cc: Don Hill) no later than end of August.

Cemetery

No report.

Christian Education

Beth Bedenbaugh submitted a written report. A committee meeting was held on 7/27. Members present were Fred Falls, Clay Falls, Tracey Hagerty, Pastor Hagerty, and Beth Bedenbaugh.

- 5. New business?
 Preschool class. Looking into starting this to allow parents of little ones to attend the adult class if they so choose. (This class started today.)
- 6. Beth proposed some wording to a plaque outside of the adult Sunday School room in memory of Lee Wessinger All approved of the wording.

7. Fred expressed a need for more Study Bibles for the adult class. We will search online for some used ones, since the edition that we use is out of print. More to follow.

Property

- 1. We have signed the contract with Duffie Driveway Solutions as approved by the council via email for \$2,080.00 to repoint the mortar between the steps of the Church. Work to be completed on Monday, 8/11 and ready for use after 8/12.
- 2. Trinity Window and Home Washing to soft wash the Church and Fellowship Hall at a cost of \$1,470.00 as approved by the council via email. This work will be done on 8/14.
- 3. Initial discussion with Ricky Waites about site location for a sycamore tree to be planted. Will need a 50-foot by 50-foot location to hold a tree that will grow 80 plus feet tall. More to follow.
- 4. Bickley Cooling checked the Sanctuary AC and found it to be working fine but suggested that we run the thermostat down and let run to cool on these hot summer days if we have events at the church in the afternoon.
- 5. Bickley Cooling checked the ice maker and found a bad water pump, which has been ordered and will be replaced once the part is in. Ice maker is now fixed as of 8/30.
 - A Property Committee meeting has been scheduled for 8/28.

Outreach and Evangelism

The committee met on August 5th. Committee members present were: Pastor, Susan Waites, Christy Brasington, Beth Ervin, and Gale Smith.

- 1. Visitations Christy reported that six people had calls or visits in July.

 Three were updated to no visits or just a call.
- AED Pastor reported that having the AED would not affect our insurance. Beth will check on status of purchase. The AED, CPR, and First Aid training class was held on August 9th. Eight people attended. The cost was covered by memorial fund monies.
- 3. The CPR instructor recommends getting a Life-Vac unit for the church. They cost about \$100 and can save a life of a person who is choking. It can be included in our first aid kit, which will need to be moved to both a larger space and a more prominent location.
- 4. Self defense class was very successful. Six ladies attended. May repeat having a class in January of 2026. Target may be college kids who are away from home.
- 5. Yoga Class on hold.
- 6. Movie night date set for Friday, November 14th at 6:30 pm; rain or shine. Beth is checking on showing early Christmas movie. Target is for kids and adults who come with them. Eve-

- ryone welcome. Plan to have popcorn and drinks. Bring your own chair.
- 7. Visitation and prayer request cards. Sharon will print another supply. Ushers will re-stock the cards in the pew racks.
- 8. Usher training was also discussed for present ushers and those who want to become an usher.
- 9. Game night Gale will post a sign-up sheet in the narthex. We will gauge interest and have the group get together to determine day, time, frequency, or to include pot luck meal. Beth Bedenbaugh offered to donate games, since the cabinet space at her home has been reduced following their renovation. Most of the games to be donated are either new or in in excellent condition.
- 10. Cooking class more to come.
- 11. Budget Beth Ervin generated a detailed budget plan for the committee. The committee will ask for \$400 in the 2026 budget.
- 12. The Advent brunch will be held on Sunday December 14th.
- 13. Next meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 15th at 6:00 pm.

Children's and Youth Ministry

There is nothing new, as we have been off for the summer. The next step is for the committee to have a planning meeting with 2. parents and youth.

Worship and Music

- Ginny attended the celebration of son Zachary's internship at Epiphany Lutheran Church in Winston Salem, NC on Sunday, July 27th. Laura Langston was our guest musician at Saint Thomas that day.
- Looking ahead to Homecoming: Zach Lindler will preach on September 28th 2025 and Rev. Robert Miles will preach on September 27th 2026 for our 150th anniversary.
- 3. Our Homecoming 2025 will feature the results of the Carolina vs Clemson food donations for We Care. On four Sundays, from August 31st through September 21st. we will collect food in milk crates marked Carolina or Clemson. We will weigh the amounts every Monday and keep everyone posted on how the competition is going. The winning team will have the center table adorn their school colors.
- 4. The adult choir resumed on Monday, July 28th at 6:30 pm.

Old Business

1. We are still planning to have some sort of recognition of members of Saint Thomas who have served the church with distinction. It may involve having family members nominate their loved ones for this recognition. More to follow on this.

2. The offering tabulators for the second Sunday of the month are Norman Wilson and Ronnie Lindler. Fred Falls and Don Hill are the tabulators on the third Sunday.

New Business

- 1. During the CPR training, there was no Wi-Fi access in the fellowship hall. The old password did not work. Subsequent to the training, the new user word and password were found listed on the wall by Sharon's desk. The WIFI was working for the funeral of George Lindler on 8/23 using the new password.
- 2. Don suggested that we start a St Thomas men's group. We could think up a variety of activities, such as cigar night, target shooting, or pocket billiards, wherein men can get together in fellowship as well as think of some service projects. More to follow.

Synod Resolutions

Pastor led the discussion on the three resolutions adopted at the 2025 SC Synod Assembly. He began by stating that all ELCA congregations have autonomy and are not mandated to agree with a given resolution, nor to act on them.

Christy looked up the definition of a resolution. A resolution is a formal statement expressing an opinion or the will of an organization or a body...often used to address specific issues or to express sentiments without having the force of law.

The first resolution is on Child Protection. Their suggestions include many of the

things that we are already doing at Saint Thomas, such as requiring signed permission forms in order to share photographs or videos of children. We also have an opendoor policy, where we do not allow any one-on-one situations where an adult is alone with a child.

Pastor discussed the second resolution on Refugee Resettlement. This resolution involves Lutheran Service of the Carolinas (LSC), which lost government funding of their program to assist legal, vetted refugees with resettlement. Those who agree with supporting those who have been hurt by the funding cut can advocate for the organization through prayer, financial support, volunteer work, and/or communication. ELCA Lutherans in the SC Synod are certainly not bound to support LSC. The third resolution is on Fulfilling our

Baptismal Call through truth, unity and transparency in the South Carolina Synod. In our discussion, Don wondered why we need to have a resolution on telling the truth. Doesn't it go without saying? The resolution encourages truth telling, checking what is fact or hearsay, and not spreading rumors.

Pastor concluded the meeting with the Lord's Prayer at 12:22 pm.


Next meeting: Saturday, September 27 9am to set up and decorate the Fellowship Hall for Homecoming.


