

Satan Is After Your Faith

Luke 22:31-34

At the Last Supper, Jesus told Peter that Satan desired to sift him as wheat, but Jesus told him that he had already prayed for him. He prayed that Peter's faith would not fail.

1 Peter 5:8 says be sober, well balanced and self-disciplined. Be cautious at all times. The enemy, the devil, prowls around like a lion seeking whom he may devour. Resist him and stand firm in the faith because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings.

The same devil that existed in the garden of Eden is still actively committing evil and destruction today, but the Word of God says be strong in the Lord and the power of his might. Put on the whole armor of God so that you can stand against the wiles of the devil.

If there are any mountains in your life, speak to them that they may be removed. You can say move from there and it will move and nothing will be impossible for you. You must have mustard seed faith.

Sifting wheat involves being violently beaten and shaken in order to separate the grain from the chaff. Sifting is a painful process, but it is required in order to grow in Christ.

In this life we will have troubles, but God is with us. We are not wrestling against flesh and blood, but spiritual wickedness in high places. Satan is the accuser of the brethren and he targets God's anointed. We must place our trust in God and not in our own self-confidence. God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.
