



Jailyn got saved back in May and I talked to him about getting baptized. He was wanting to, but he wanted his family to be here, they were finally able to make it, and with about 10 members of his family here to witness it, he finally was baptized. He has continued to attend faithfully and is growing in his newfound faith.

Abrahan, yes with an "n," was invited to church by Alesis, and stayed to eat lunch with us at the Serviceman Center after church. He was one of the 10 Marines that needed a haircut and I talked to him during his haircut he realized his need of salvation, so after he was finished getting his haircut he sat at the table with a Bible, and I explained salvation while I was giving the next haircut. He turned and read, and I explained and answered questions that he asked. Then when he said he understood he bowed his head and asked the Lord to forgive his sins and to save him. He has been attending church and Bible study ever since.

We went by to check on one of the Marines that had not been to church in over a month and found out he had moved units. 



When I attended college (Appalachian State University), I was privileged to take several classes that I did not enjoy very much. Such is the case with all of us. But the ones out of which I received the most fulfillment were those that not only were in my chosen field of study, but were those rare electives that allowed me to study something in which I was interested. One of those was a creative writing class that also touched on areas of journalism. There, we were told that the best articles, and stories for that matter, always answer the questions – "Who? When? Where? How? And why?"

Many of us have known this to be the case, in regards to newspapers and research projects. But it also applies to ministry. In recent years I have found myself very disappointed with the attitudes and agendas of many of us in the areas of worship. Please note that I said "us." For we are all susceptible to this trap, if we are not careful. It manifests itself in such a selfish and self-serving way. It says, "My ministry of preaching, singing, instrumental performance, etc., is of such quality and ability that it is not only important that I am featured, but I must also be given those prime, spotlight opportunities to showcase my talent." In other words, it would appear that the "when" has become more important than the "why" or the "for Whom." Sadly, I have watched this take place, and take root, in the hearts of far too many.

I am convinced today more than ever that if the "why" and the "for Whom" are not right then the "when" does not matter. Preaching, singing, ministering in any capacity is as important on Wednesday night, as it is on Sunday morning. It is as vital and as essential at the nursing home to the ten or twelve residents that look forward to it every week, as it is to the hundreds that may sit on a pew on Sundays. When we allow ourselves to be caught up in a numbers game or be so enamored by our position on the stage, then we have lost sight of what matters most in eternity. And while someone reading this may be quick to point out that Jesus ministered to hundreds and thousands, let us not forget that He "must needs go through Samaria" so that He could share the Gospel with one outcast woman, at a well.

Always remember that the "why" and the "for Whom" must be driven by a desire to serve the Lord with what He has given to us. Why do we preach or teach or sing? Is it to receive the approval or applause of men? Or is it to please God? My friends, we serve the One that has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light. We minister in the name of the One that rescued us from the mire and put us in the choir. We labor on behalf of the One that loved us and gave Himself for us. Therefore, the "why" must come from a heart filled with thanksgiving for Him saving and using someone like us.

Lest anyone think that I have forgotten the other questions that need to answered, let me explain that the how and the where are also important. Remembering that God gave His best for us, we should always strive to give our best to Him. We should serve with the thought in mind of having excellence in our ministry; of doing whatever it is that we are privileged to do with a high degree of quality. Therefore, practice and study, prepare and pray, and then let the service in public pour forth from the overflow of what God has done in us in private. And yes, the where is also significant.

So, preacher and teacher, missionary and evangelist, singer and servant, accept those invitations to be with a large gathering of believers or in a place where you can share the Gospel with a multitude of people that have never heard. But don't overlook those small, seemingly insignificant fields; those times where only a handful of faithful, hungry, hurting souls need to hear a word from Heaven and be reminded of all that God has done for us. Take advantage of every God-given opportunity whether on a Sunday morning or a Thursday afternoon, to thousands or to two, and serve Him with gladness knowing that He knows the reasons behind all of our service to Him and before others.
